BILL SUMMARY

- Prohibits school districts from paying any teacher a salary of less than \$20,000 per year.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Minimum salary schedule

(sec. 3317.13)

Under current law, no teacher may be paid a salary less than the amount set forth in a statutory salary schedule. The schedule assigns minimum amounts based on years of service and education level. The current minimum schedule, exclusive of retirement and sick leave, ranges from \$14,705 for teachers with no experience and less than a bachelor's degree, \$17,000 for a teacher with no experience and a bachelor's degree, to \$27,591 for a teacher with a master's degree or higher and 11 years of service.

The bill specifies that notwithstanding the schedule, no teacher shall be paid a salary, exclusive of retirement and sick leave, of less than \$20,000.
