BILL SUMMARY

- Requires the Director of Natural Resources to erect and maintain a privacy fence between a state recreational trail used for hiking or bicycling and private land that is adjacent to the trail upon the written request of the owner of the land.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill provides that if an individual who owns land that is adjacent to a state recreational trail used for hiking or bicycling submits a written request for a privacy fence to the Director of Natural Resources, the Director must erect and maintain a privacy fence between the individual's land and the adjacent state recreational trail. The bill defines "privacy fence" as a barrier that is constructed of nontransparent material, is at least six feet in height, and is erected and maintained so as to obscure adjacent land from the ordinary view of individuals who are passing upon state recreational trails used for hiking or bicycling.
