BILL SUMMARY

- Authorizes the Administrator of Workers' Compensation to transfer surplus computers and computer equipment to a county board of mental retardation and developmental disabilities.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Existing law

Generally, under existing law, state agencies are required to notify the Director of Administrative Services when they have excess or surplus supplies. The Director generally is required to dispose of the supplies by sale, lease, donation, or transfer to certain agencies, institutions of higher education, nonpublic elementary and secondary schools, political subdivisions, or the general public according to a specified priority (secs. 125.12 to 125.14, not in, but referred to by, the bill).

The Administrator of the Bureau of Workers' Compensation currently has authority to transfer surplus computers and computer equipment directly to an accredited public school without proceeding through the Director of Administrative Services (sec. 4121.121(B)(9)).¹

Change proposed by the bill

The bill additionally authorizes the Administrator of Workers' Compensation to transfer surplus computers and computer equipment directly to a county board of mental retardation and developmental disabilities (sec. 4121.121(B)(9)).
