BILL SUMMARY

- Designates a portion of U.S. Route 33 within Logan County as the "Edward K. Core Memorial Highway" for a period of nine years.
- Requires the Director of Transportation to erect markers along the highway indicating its name and also requires the Director to present the markers to the family of Edward K. Core upon expiration of the highway designation.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Current law designates United States route 33 as the "Marine Corps League Memorial Highway" and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name. The designation extends the length of the highway within Ohio, from Van Wert County in the west to Meigs County in the southeast. (R.C. 5533.63.)

In addition to the designation under current law, the bill designates a portion of United States route 33 as the "Edward K. Core Memorial Highway." The portion designated by the bill is located within Logan County and extends from the Union County line to Logan County Road 57. The designation is for a period of nine years after the effective date of the bill.

The bill requires the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name. Nine years after the bill's effective date, the portion designated by the bill ceases to be known as the "Edward K. Core Memorial Highway." When the designation expires, the Director must remove the markers erected along the highway indicating its name and must present the markers to the family of Edward K. Core. (R.C. 5533.631.)
