**ACT SUMMARY**

- Designates a portion of Interstate 71 within Ashland County as the "Trooper James R. Gross Memorial Highway."

---

**CONTENT AND OPERATION**

Continuing law designates Interstate 71 throughout the entire state as the "Disabled American Veterans' Highway." In addition to this designation, the act designates a two-mile portion of Interstate 71 within Ashland County as the "Trooper James R. Gross Memorial Highway." The act also authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name. (Sec. 5533.33.)
