BILL SUMMARY

- Provides that any person who is required to register with the Selective Service System, upon submission of an application for issuance or renewal of a driver's license, is deemed to have given consent for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) to forward to the Selective Service System the necessary information for such registration.
- Requires the BMV, upon receipt of an application from such a person, to forward to the Selective Service System the personal information necessary for registration unless the applicant indicates in writing that the applicant previously has registered.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Under the bill, any person who is required to register with the Selective Service System in accordance with the Military Selective Service Act of 1967, upon submission of an application for issuance or renewal of a license, is deemed to have given consent for the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) to forward to the Selective Service System the necessary information for such registration (sec. 4507.062(B)). As used in the bill, "license" includes a driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary instruction permit, or identification card (sec. 4507.062(A)).

Upon receipt of an application from any person who is required to register with the Selective Service System, the BMV is required to forward to the System, in an electronic format acceptable to the System, the personal information necessary for such registration. The BMV is not required to forward the personal information, however, if the applicant indicates in writing that the applicant previously has registered with the Selective Service System. (Sec. 4507.062(C).)

The bill requires every application for a license to do all of the following:

- (1) State that submission of the application indicates the applicant's consent to registration with the Selective Service System, if so required;
- (2) State that if an applicant so required to register is under age 18, the BMV will register the applicant upon the applicant turning age 18; and
- (3) Allow an applicant to indicate that the applicant previously has registered with the Selective Service System (sec. 4507.062(D)).

The bill's provisions are to take effect six months after the effective date of the bill (Section 2).
