BILL SUMMARY

- Prohibits the holder of a permit for the sale of beer or intoxicating liquor for on-site consumption from hiring a security person who has not successfully completed a training program approved by the Liquor Control Commission.
- Authorizes the Commission to adopt rules governing training programs for those security personnel, and requires the rules to include specified requirements.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill prohibits the holder of a permit issued by the Division of Liquor Control in the Department of Commerce that authorizes the sale of beer or intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises where sold from hiring a person to provide security at the premises for which the permit was issued unless that person has successfully completed a training program approved by the Liquor Control Commission pursuant to rules it adopts (sec. 4301.211). The bill authorizes the Commission to adopt rules governing such training programs; the rules must include requirements for the content of the training programs, dispute resolution techniques and methods of dealing peacefully with customers, and provisions for designating approved training programs (sec. 4301.03(K)).
