### **BILL SUMMARY**

- Directs the Ohio Board of Regents to adopt rules requiring state universities to guarantee that a full-time undergraduate student with a declared major field of study can complete the required coursework in a specified time period.

---

### **CONTENT AND OPERATION**

The bill directs the Ohio Board of Regents to adopt rules requiring state universities to guarantee that a full-time undergraduate student with a declared major field of study can complete the coursework required for the degree in a time period specified for that particular major.<sup>1</sup> The rules must include a provision ensuring that universities maintain reasonable course availability. Presumably once rules are adopted, if a student at a state university has a declared major and the university states that a full-time student can complete that major in four years, the university would be required to guarantee that the student could graduate within four years.
