BILL SUMMARY

- Requires the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and deputy registrars to ask each person who is at least 18 years old and is applying for or renewing a driver's license whether the person has executed or wishes to execute a durable power of attorney for health care or a living will.
- Permits an applicant who has executed either type of instrument to indicate on the applicant's license that the applicant has executed the instrument.
- Requires the Registrar and deputy registrars to offer free copies of the durable power of attorney for health care and the living will forms.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill requires the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and deputy registrars to ask each person who is at least 18 years old and is applying for or renewing a driver's license, commercial driver's license, temporary instruction permit, or identification card whether the person has executed or wishes to execute a durable power of attorney for health care or a declaration governing the use or continuation, or the withholding or withdrawal, of life-sustaining treatment (commonly known as a "living will"). If the applicant has executed either type of instrument, the Registrar or deputy registrar must ask whether the applicant wishes the applicant's license to indicate that the applicant has executed the instrument. If the applicant has not executed either type of instrument, the Registrar or deputy registrar must offer the person a free copy of the durable power of attorney for health care and the living will forms.
