### **BILL SUMMARY**

- Requires the Director of Transportation to designate a portion of a state highway as a memorial highway in honor of every state highway patrol trooper who is or has been killed in the line of duty.

---

### **CONTENT AND OPERATION**

The bill requires the Director of Transportation, in consultation with the Director of Public Safety and the Superintendent of the State Highway Patrol, to designate a portion of a state highway not exceeding 20 miles in length as a memorial highway in honor of every State Highway Patrol trooper who is or has been killed in the line of duty. In doing so, the Director may designate a portion of a state highway that already has been given a statutory designation; if this occurs, the portion of the state highway will have both names. If the Director designates a portion of a highway and that portion subsequently is given a statutory designation, that portion of the state highway will have both names unless the statutory designation expressly provides otherwise.

If the Director makes a designation under the bill, suitable markers may be erected along the highway indicating its name.
