## BILL SUMMARY

- Eliminates the 200,000 minimum population criterion that governs which counties may employ delinquent real property tax collectors, thereby authorizing counties with populations of less than 200,000 to employ them.

---

## CONTENT AND OPERATION

### Collection of delinquent real property taxes

(R.C. 5721.021)

Current law provides that a board of county commissioners serving a county with a population of at least 200,000, with the consent of the prosecuting attorney, may authorize the county treasurer to employ tax collectors to collect delinquent real property taxes, fix their compensation, and provide for their necessary expenses, which are paid out of the county treasury.

The bill eliminates the 200,000 minimum population criterion, thereby permitting counties, regardless of their population, to authorize the county treasurer to employ delinquent real property tax collectors, with the consent of the prosecuting attorney.
