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## ACT SUMMARY

- Designates one memorial bridge and one memorial highway.

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## CONTENT AND OPERATION

### "Staff Sgt. James P. Hunter Memorial Bridge"

The act designates the bridge spanning the Vermillion River that is part of State Route 113 and is located in the community of Birmingham in Erie County, as the "Staff Sgt. James P. Hunter Memorial Bridge," and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers upon the bridge or its approaches indicating its name.<sup>1</sup> Staff Sgt. James P. Hunter, an Army journalist, died in Afghanistan on June 18, 2010 of injuries sustained when insurgents attacked his unit with an improvised explosive device.

### "Trooper George Conn Memorial Highway"

The act designates part of State Route 800, commencing at the northeast border of Freeport in Harrison County and extending in a northeasterly direction to the intersection of State Route 800 and State Route 799, as the "Trooper George Conn

Memorial Highway," and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name.<sup>2</sup> State Highway Patrol Trooper George Conn was shot and killed while on duty near Freeport on September 27, 1937.
