ACT SUMMARY

- Designates a portion of State Route 58 within Lorain County, commencing at the intersection of State Route 58 and State Route 511 and proceeding in a northerly direction to the intersection of State Route 58 and the road known as Cleveland Avenue to the west of that route and as North Ridge Road East to the east of that route, as the "Sgt. Louis Torres Memorial Highway."¹
- Designates a portion of Interstate Route 270 within Franklin County, commencing at the intersection of that interstate route and West Broad Street and running in a southeasterly direction to the intersection of that interstate route and United States Route 62, as the "Army Specialist Nicholas E. Zimmer Memorial Highway."
- Specifies that the act's designation of a portion of Interstate Route 270 is in addition to any other name prescribed in the Revised Code or otherwise.²

- Authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along each highway indicating its name.

COMMENT

Army Sergeant Louis Torres died on August 22, 2012 as the result of injuries caused by an improvised explosive device while on duty in Kandahar, Afghanistan.

Army Specialist Nicholaus E. Zimmer died in Iraq on May 30, 2004, when his vehicle was struck by rocket-propelled grenades.
