BILL SUMMARY

- Designates 11 memorial highways and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along each highway indicating its name.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill designates 11 memorial highways and, in each case, authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name.

"U.S. Army Specialist Ryan A. Martin Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 3 located in Knox County, running in a northeasterly and southwesterly direction from the Knox County and Ashland County line to the community of Amity, as the "U.S. Army Specialist Ryan A. Martin Memorial Highway." This designation is in addition to any other name prescribed in the Revised Code or otherwise.¹

U.S. Army Specialist Ryan A. Martin died in Iraq on August 20, 2004, when an improvised explosive device exploded near his vehicle.

The portion of State Route 3 that is the subject of the bill currently carries the designation "Thirty-seventh Division Memorial Highway."²

"Sfc. Charles L. Adkins Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 101 located in Erie County, running in a northeasterly and southwesterly direction between the municipal corporations of Castalia and Sandusky, as the "Sfc. Charles L. Adkins Memorial Highway."³

Army Sgt. 1st Class Charles L. Adkins was killed by a suicide bomber in Afghanistan on April 16, 2011.

"Lance Corporal Jeremy S. Shock Memorial Highway"

The bill designates the portion of State Route 19, running in a northerly and southerly direction through the village of Green Springs in Sandusky and Seneca counties, as the "Lance Corporal Jeremy S. Shock Memorial Highway."⁴

U.S. Marine Lance Corporal Jeremy S. Shock died on November 19, 2006, from wounds he suffered in Iraq after the vehicle in which he was traveling struck a roadside bomb.

"Corporal Ernest G. Madden Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 45 in Columbiana County from the intersection of State Route 45 and Lisbon Street in the municipal corporation of Wellsville and extending in a northerly direction through Yellow Creek Township to the Madison Township line, as the "Corporal Ernest G. Madden Memorial Highway."⁵

Marine Corporal Ernest G. Madden was killed during combat operations in Vietnam on May 12, 1967.

"U.S. Army Specialist Allen Nolan Memorial Highway"

The bill designates the portion of State Route 676 in Washington County, from mile marker 22 to mile marker 23, as the "U.S. Army Specialist Allen Nolan Memorial Highway."⁶

U.S. Army Specialist Allen Nolan died on September 30, 2004, from wounds he received in Iraq when his convoy vehicle struck an improvised explosive device and then came under small arms fire.

"U.S.M.C. Sgt. Nathaniel Shae Rock Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 7 in Jefferson County, running in a north and south direction, between mile markers 24 and 22 as the "U.S.M.C. Sgt. Nathaniel Shae Rock Memorial Highway."⁷

Marine Sgt. Nathaniel Shae Rock died on August 1, 2005 while serving during Operation Iraqi Freedom.

"Spc. Adam S. Hamilton Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 43 in Portage County, commencing at the intersection of State Route 43 and Fairchild Avenue within the city of Kent and proceeding in a northerly direction to the northern boundary of Kent, as the "Spc. Adam S. Hamilton Memorial Highway."⁸

Army Specialist Adam S. Hamilton died May 28, 2011 while serving in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

"Officer William J. Hetrick Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 51 in Ottawa County, commencing at the intersection of that route and Witty Road and proceeding in a northwesterly direction to the intersection of State Route 51 and State Route 795 as the "Officer William J. Hetrick Memorial Highway."⁹

Clay Township Police Officer William J. Hetrick was killed in an automobile accident while on duty on July 10, 2000.

"Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II Memorial Highway"

The bill designates the portion of State Route 725, commencing at its intersection with Heincke Road within the municipal corporation of Miamisburg and proceeding in an easterly direction to its intersection with State Route 741 within Montgomery County only, as the "Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II Memorial Highway."¹⁰

Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II died on June 3, 2011, while conducting combat operations in Afghanistan.

"Pfc. Jeffrey L. Rice Memorial Highway"

The bill designates a portion of State Route 55, running in an easterly direction between the municipal corporations of Troy and Casstown in Miami County, as the "Pfc. Jeffrey L. Rice Memorial Highway."¹¹

Army Pfc. Jeffrey L. Rice was killed in Kandahar, Afghanistan on July 19, 2012.

"Lt. Miroslav Steven Zilberman Memorial Highway"

The bill designates the portion of Interstate Route 270, commencing at the intersection of that interstate route and United States Route 33 in southeast Franklin County and proceeding in a westerly, then northerly, and then easterly direction to the intersection of that interstate route and State Route 315 in northwest Franklin County, as the "Lt. Miroslav Steven Zilberman Memorial Highway." This is in addition to any other name prescribed in the Revised Code or otherwise.¹²

Naval aviator Lt. Miroslav Steven Zilberman died on March 31, 2010, after his aircraft crashed into the Arabian Sea while on the return trip from a mission in Afghanistan.

The portion of Interstate Route 270 that is the subject of the bill currently carries the designations "Trooper Frank G. Vazquez Memorial Highway"¹³ "Trooper Wendy G. Everett Memorial Highway,"¹⁴ "Captain Nicholas J. Rozanski Memorial Highway,"¹⁵

"Master Sergeant Jeffrey J. Rieck Memorial Highway,"¹⁶ and "Jack Nicklaus Freeway."¹⁷ Some of the portion of Interstate Route 270 that is the subject of the bill currently also may carry the designation "Trooper Jody S. Dye Memorial Highway."¹⁸
