BILL SUMMARY

- Requires an applicant for a hunting license to indicate on the application whether the applicant has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a felony.
- Requires a hunting license form to include the words "firearm restricted" adjacent to a box that must be checked if an applicant has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a felony.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill requires every applicant for a hunting license to include in the application whether the applicant has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a felony in addition to the applicant's name, date of birth, weight, height, and place of residence and any other information that the Chief of the Division of Wildlife may require as specified in current law. The bill then requires the hunting license form to include the words "firearm restricted" adjacent to a box that the issuing agent must check if an applicant has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a felony.
