## BILL SUMMARY

- Expands the work-related expenses that may be paid for by a credit card held by a board of county commissioners or the office of any other county appointing authority.

---

## CONTENT AND OPERATION

### Additional county work-related expenses that may be paid by credit card

The bill adds the following expenses to the list of work-related expenses that may be paid for by a credit card held by a board of county commissioners or the office of any other county appointing authority:<sup>1</sup>

- ♦ Webinar expenses.

- ♦ Expenses for purchases of automatic or electronic data processing or record-keeping equipment, software, or services, provided that, in a county that has established an automatic data processing board, the county office and the county officer or employee authorized to use the credit card comply with existing law's requirements that apply to automatic data processing boards and their acquisition of equipment. These expenses cannot exceed \$10,000 per quarter, unless the board of county commissioners adopts a resolution approving the payment, by credit card, of the expenses that exceed that amount during that time period.<sup>2</sup>

Existing law not changed by the bill allows a credit card to be used to pay food, transportation, gasoline and oil, motor vehicle repair and maintenance, telephone, lodging, and Internet service provider expenses, and, in the case of a public children services agency, expenses for certain purchases for children for whom the agency is providing care.<sup>3</sup>
