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After a strong December, the personal income tax fell below estimate for the month of January by \$16.4 million (1.6%), resulting in a negative year-to-date (YTD) variance of \$19.2 million (0.4%).

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- On the other hand, the sales and use tax, the largest GRF tax, had a positive variance in January of \$31.2 million (3.1%), increasing its positive YTD variance to \$110.6 million (1.7%). The commercial activity tax also had positive variances for the month and YTD of \$11.0 million (15.1%) and \$33.7 million (3.9%), respectively.
- GRF taxes as a whole exceeded estimate by \$44.7 million (2.0%) for January and by \$138.0 million (1.0%) YTD.
- Federal grants deposited into the GRF had a positive variance in January of \$84.0 million (9.9%) and a positive YTD variance of \$94.3 million (1.5%).
- Federal grants in the GRF are reimbursements for the federal share of Medicaid expenditures made from the GRF, which were also above estimate in January. GRF Medicaid expenditures were \$161.9 million (12.7%) above estimate in January and \$108.2 million (1.1%) above estimate YTD.
- All program categories other than Medicaid had negative YTD variances at the end of January. Total program expenditures were below estimate by \$146.9 million (0.7%) YTD.
