Executive Summary

This report contains information on the financial situation of all boards, commissions and agencies that regulate occupations and professions, as defined in Ohio Revised Code section 4743.01. Each individual board provided information for this report.

Most of the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Boards listed in this report deposit funds into the Occupational and Professional Licensing Fund, also known as Fund 4K9. The Office of Budget and Management reports that Fund 4K9 has a substantial positive balance and will operate with a healthy surplus for some time.

The Ohio Athletic Commission was the only board using moneys from Fund 4K9 that reported a loss both in FY2000 and in FY2001. The Commission's operating deficit in FY2000 was \$121,821 and in FY2001 the deficit was \$127,318. In the Governor's proposed budget, it was suggested that the Athletic Commission be removed from Fund 4K9 and be placed in the General Revenue Fund. The Commission also requested it be given the authority to levy a 5% gate tax on all professional wrestling spectator events in Ohio as a means of generating more revenue. However, the budget act did not incorporate either suggestion.

Three other boards using money from Fund 4K9 have reported a loss in either FY2000 or FY 2001 resulting in a net loss for the two years covered by this report. The Counselor and Social Workers Board had a two-year deficit of \$22,703; the Ohio State Dental Board had a two-year deficit of \$88,832 and the State Board of Examiners of Landscape Architects reported a two-year deficit of \$7,798.

Introduction

Ohio's Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Boards

Ohio's various occupational and licensing boards monitor, license, and regulate selected occupations and professions. Many of the regulated professions provide services in technical and specialized fields such as nursing, medicine, and engineering, in which the failure to meet minimum standards could be dangerous or costly. The boards are charged to help ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the public by ensuring the professionals who practice in these fields meet certain standards.

To fulfill the requirements of Section 103.13 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Legislative Service Commission prepares this report annually to evaluate the extent to which these state boards and commissions are financially self-supporting. This report provides a summary of the financial activities and some of the legislative changes that took place during FY2001 (July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001). The information in this report is divided into three main sections that are described below.

General Information – Section one begins with a description of the functions of each licensing or regulatory board, followed by a brief description of any legislation that became effective in FY2001 that affects any of the boards. This section also contains a table of general information, such as staffing levels and renewal cycles for each board.

Active Licenses – Section two lists the total number of active licenses for each board for this fiscal year and the previous fiscal year. The change in the total number of licenses from the last fiscal year to this fiscal year is also calculated.

Revenues and Expenditures – The final section contains information on the revenues and expenditures for each board for fiscal years 2000 and 2001. This information is separated by the renewal cycles for each board. Many of the boards renew licenses biennially and, therefore, receive the bulk of their fee revenues every other year. The table contains information on both Fund 4K9 revenues and expenditures and any non-Fund 4K9 revenues and expenditures. The table also shows the changes in both revenues and expenditures from FY2000 to FY2001 and the net gain for the two fiscal years combined.

Finally, the appendix lists the name of each board's chief administrator and the board's address and phone number.

General Information: Board Descriptions

ACCOUNTANCY BOARD OF OHIO

The Accountancy Board tests, licenses, and regulates individuals and firms who practice accounting in this state to ensure that the services being provided are ethical and professional in manner and in accordance with all appropriate laws and standards.

AMBULANCE LICENSING BOARD, OHIO

The Ambulance Licensing Board identifies, inspects and licenses all private ambulances and Mobile Intensive Care Units in the State of Ohio.

ARCHITECTS AND LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS, STATE BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF

The Board of Examiners of Architects and Landscape Architects regulates the practice of architecture and landscape architecture through education, training, examination, and practice standards.

ATHLETIC COMMISSION, OHIO

The Ohio Athletic Commission regulates boxing, wrestling, kick boxing, karate, and tough person contests within the State of Ohio in an effort to protect the safety of the participants, the integrity of the sports, and the interests of the public.

BARBER BOARD, OHIO STATE

The Barber Board licenses barbers, barber shops, and barber schools. The board protects the health and welfare of the consuming public by setting standards for licensure and by enforcing these standards through exams, investigations, and disciplinary actions.

BUILDING STANDARDS, BOARD OF

The Board of Building Standards certifies local building departments to enforce the Ohio Building Code. The Board also promulgates the state building code, boiler code, elevator code and pressure piping systems code.

CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS, STATE OF OHIO BOARD OF

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners protects the health and welfare of Ohio's citizens through licensure, enforcing these licensure standards through examination, renewal, clinical inspection, investigation and disciplinary action.

COSMETOLOGY, STATE BOARD OF

The State Board of Cosmetology maintains sanitary and professional standards through the licensure and regulation of the profession of cosmetology.

COUNSELOR AND SOCIAL WORKER BOARD

The Counselor and Social Worker Board regulates the professions of counseling and social work by establishing licensure and practice standards for the professions.

DENTAL BOARD, OHIO STATE

The Dental Board licenses and regulates the practice of dentistry, dental hygiene, and dental assistant radiography in Ohio.

General Information: Board Descriptions

DIETETICS, OHIO BOARD OF

The Board of Dietetics protects the health and safety of Ohio citizens by regulating the practice of dietetics as defined in the Revised Code.

EMBALMERS AND FUNERAL DIRECTORS, BOARD OF

The Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors licenses and regulates embalmers, funeral directors, funeral homes, crematories and embalming facilities. The Board also resolves complaints against any of those who are regulated.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, BOARD OF

The Board of Emergency Medical Services oversees training and certifies all emergency medical technicians and firefighters. The Board approves all training institutions and instructors, as well as administers its grant fund.

FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS, DIVISION OF

The Division of Financial Institutions acts as the primary regulatory authority over state-chartered banks, savings banks, savings & loans, credit unions; and licenses and regulates money transmitters, consumer finance companies, pawnbrokers, mortgage brokers, check cashers, precious metal dealers, insurance premium finance companies, and credit service organizations.

HEARING AID DEALERS AND FITTERS LICENSING BOARD

The Hearing Aid Dealers and Fitters Licensing Board licenses all hearing aid dealers pursuant to the requirements of the Revised Code.

INDUSTRIAL COMPLIANCE, DIVISION OF

The Division of Industrial Compliance safeguards the health, safety, and welfare of Ohio's workers and citizens by regulating individuals in the building trades, such as steam engineers and boiler inspectors. The Division also provides building and construction plans reviews.

STATE MEDICAL BOARD OF OHIO

The State Medical Board of Ohio is charged to protect and enhance the health and welfare of Ohio's citizens by regulating the practice of Doctors of Medicine, Doctors of Osteopathic Medicine, and Doctors of Podiatric Medicine, as well as Limited Practitioners and Physician's Assistants.

MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION REPAIR REGISTRATION, BOARD OF

The Board of Motor Vehicle Collision Repair Registration registers all independent collision repair facilities.

MOTOR VEHICLE DEALER LICENSING BOARD

The Motor Vehicle Dealer Licensing Board carries out all of the due process functions necessary to identify violators, charge them with the violations, and to effectuate the suspension and revocation of the licenses of such violators.

General Information: Board Descriptions

MOTOR VEHICLE SALVAGE DEALER LICENSING BOARD

The Motor Vehicle Salvage Dealer Licensing Board carries out all of the due process functions necessary to identify violators, charge them with the violations, and to effectuate the suspension and revocation of the licenses of such violators.

NURSING, OHIO BOARD OF

The State Board of Nursing serves as a safeguard for the health, welfare, and safety of the public and protects the public against unqualified practitioners of nursing. The Board regulates the professions of nursing and dialysis care.

NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATORS, BOARD OF EXAMINERS OF

The Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators Board uses its statutory powers to develop, adopt, impose, and enforce regulations prescribing standards which must be met by individuals to receive a license as a nursing home administrator.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY, PHYSICAL THERAPY, AND ATHLETIC TRAINERS' BOARD

The Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, and Athletic Trainers' Board provides licenses to occupational therapists, physical therapists, and athletic trainers and approves continuing education for all of the fields except physical therapy.

OPTICAL DISPENSERS' BOARD, OHIO

The Optical Dispensers' Board regulates the practice of opticianry and ocularistry through examination, continuing education and license enforcement.

OPTOMETRY, OHIO STATE BOARD OF

The Board of Optometry carries out the responsibilities listed in the Revised Code relating to examinations, licensing, continuing education, compliance, investigation, and enforcement activities for all Ohio optometrists.

ORTHOTICS, PROSTHETICS, AND PEDORTHICS, STATE BOARD OF

The Board licenses practioners in the fields of orthotics, prosthetics and pedorthics.

PHARMACY BOARD, OHIO STATE BOARD OF

The Pharmacy Board licenses all persons who distribute dangerous drugs and sites where dangerous drugs are stored in Ohio. The Board also enforces the Pharmacy Practice Act, Dangerous Drugs Distribution Act, Food and Drug Act, Controlled Substance Act, and the Criminal Code of Ohio relating to drugs.

PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND SURVEYORS, STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR

The Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors oversees the licensure and renewals of professional engineers and professional surveyors, and enforces the laws relating to these professions.

General Information: Board Descriptions

PSYCHOLOGY, STATE BOARD OF

The State Board of Psychology licenses psychologists and school psychologists. It also regulates the practice of psychology and takes enforcement action against unethical or illegal practice. The Board also registers people who work under the professional supervision of a licensee.

REAL ESTATE AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSING, DIVISION OF

The Division of Real Estate administers the law governing real estate, appraisers, cemeteries, auctioneers, private investigators, and security guard providers.

RESPIRATORY CARE BOARD, OHIO

The Ohio Respiratory Care Board regulates and licenses the practice of respiratory care by examining and licensing qualified applicants, investigating complaints, and establishing educational standards.

SANITARIAN REGISTRATION, STATE BOARD OF

The State Board of Sanitarian Registration is charged to protect the public health by ensuring that individuals who engage in the practice of environmental health possess and maintain specialized knowledge and skills that pertain to the field of environmental health science.

SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY AND AUDIOLOGY, BOARD OF

The Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology regulates the professions of speech-language pathology and audiology in accordance with the Revised Code.

VETERINARY MEDICAL BOARD, OHIO

The Ohio Veterinary Medical Board licenses, enforces, and regulates the practice of veterinary medicine in the state of Ohio.

New Legislation Enacted in FY 2001

All of the bills discussed below were passed by the 123rd General Assembly.

State Medical Board

Sub. H.B. 90 (effective October 10, 2000) allows a physician to use alternative medical treatments that meet the standards of the State Medical Board.

Am. Sub. H.B. 341 (effective August 10, 2000) prohibits any person, other than a physician, from practicing acupuncture unless such person is validly registered with the Medical Board.

The bill also changes the law so that the Medical Board may share more investigatory records with other agencies, take disciplinary actions based on conduct in other jurisdictions and receive court reports following an adjudication of mental illness.

Sub. H.B. 585 (effective April 10, 2001) redefines the practice of medicine to include persons outside of Ohio practicing medicine in Ohio through any form of oral, written or electronic communication. The Medical Board and State Board of Optometry are required to establish standards to be followed by physicians or optometrists who delegate tasks to persons who are not licensed to perform such tasks.

Ohio Athletic Commission

Am. Sub. H.B. 107 (effective March 22, 2001) authorizes the Athletic Commission to regulate athlete agents. The bill also requires that the Board have at least one member for each of the following areas of knowledge: high school athletics, collegiate athletics and professional athletics.

State Board of Emergency Medical Services

Am. Sub. H.B. 138 (effective November 3, 2000) requires the board to develop state triage protocols for the treatment of trauma victims, alters the composition of the board, and establishes a trauma committee within the board.

Division of Industrial Compliance

Am. Sub. H.B. 434 (effective March 22, 2001) creates state-wide licensure for various construction industries, and eliminates most existing authority for local governments to impose additional purely local regulations on these contractors.

Ohio Respiratory Care Board

Sub. H.B. 505 (effective October 27, 2000) makes many changes to the law concerning the Ohio Respiratory Care Board, including granting qualified immunity for acts and omissions related to the official duties of the board.

New Legislation Enacted in FY 2001

State Chiropractic Board

Sub. H.B. 506 (effective April 10, 2001) changes the law governing the operation of the board. The bill allows the board to adopt any rules necessary to regulate the practice of chiropractic and makes various other changes.

Board of Nursing

Sub. H.B. 511 (effective April 10, 2001) requires an employer to report to the board any nurse to whom the employer believes has violated a statute or rule concerning nursing. The bill makes various other changes.

Division of Real Estate and Licensing

Sub. H.B. 524 (effective September 22, 2000) adds "limited liability companies" and "limited liability partnerships" to the list of businesses affected by the licensing laws governing real estate brokers. The bill also allows the division to audit the business records of continuing education providers, among other changes.

Sub. H.B. 531 (effective September 22, 2000) increases the amount of the fee for the issuance of burial permits and increases the portion of the fee payable to the Division of Real Estate.

State Board of Pharmacy

Am. Sub. S.B. 172 (effective February 12, 2001) expands the disciplinary powers of the board.

Am. Sub. S.B. 248 (effective March 12, 2001) allows a pharmacist to administer certain immunizations through injection if the pharmacist completes required training in accordance with standards determined by the board.

State Board of Orthotics, Prosthetics and Podorthics

Am. Sub. S.B. 238 (effective October 27, 2000) requires the licensure of persons who practice orthotics, prosthetics or podorthics and creates the State Board of Orthotics, Prosthetics and Podorthics.

Revenues and Expenditures

Information in this section is divided based on each agency's renewal cycle. The boards included in this report renew licenses on a triennial, biennial or annual basis.

Agencies with a Triennial Renewal Cycle

The Accountancy Board of Ohio operates from two state funds, the 4K9 and the 4J8 Funds. The board's license revenues and the board's operational expenditures are included the 4K9 fund. Monies from the 4J8 Fund come from fees paid by licensees and are used for the board's scholarship program. The 4J8 Fund was created as a result of FY1993 legislation that increased the basic education requirements an individual must meet to become licensed as a Certified Public Accountant.

The Accountancy Board has been running large surpluses in the 4K9 Fund for the past several years. Beginning in FY1999, the Accountancy Board reduced its fees so that fee revenues will more closely match Board expenditures.

The Board of Building Standards uses the 4K9 Fund to collect license fees for Electrical Safety Inspectors. In each year, expenditures exactly match revenues. In FY1999, the Board received \$10,335 in revenues and spent \$10,335 in expenses. In FY 2000, the Board received \$9,685 in revenues and spent \$9,685 in expenses. In FY 2001, the Board received \$10,290 in revenues and spent \$10,290 in expenses.

Agencies with a Biennial Renewal Cycle

Many of the boards renew their licenses on a biennial cycle. Because of this, each board receives the bulk of its licensing revenue every other year. A board may run a deficit in its "off" year that will be eliminated during its renewal year. The two-year renewal cycle must be analyzed to determine if a board is financially self-sufficient. Data on the following page contains information on the boards with a biennial renewal cycle.
