CAP-036	Roof Replacement (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$718,013
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Projects in Marion, Erie, Hancock, Franklin, Licking, and Clark counties

Funds will be used to repair and/or replace existing roofing systems. Many of the existing systems were installed in the 1950s as new construction. Despite spot maintenance, many roofs have deteriorated and require extensive removal and replacement. The Adjutant General has requested funds to replace the roofs on three armories, one organized maintenance shop, one combined support maintenance shop, and two air base buildings.

CAP-038	Electrical Improvements/Renovations (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$821,855
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Projects in Licking, Ashland, Erie, Logan, Wood, and Hancock counties

Extensive upgrades are needed to meet increasing technical and operational demands. Funds will be used to assess compliance with the appropriate building codes, and system capabilities will be tested to see if current demands for electricity can be met. Repairs will be made to equipment and distribution management systems.

CAP-044	Replace Windows/Doors (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$689,653
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Projects in Franklin, Huron, Summit, and Delaware counties.

Funds will be used to repair and/or remove replace windows and doors at various armories. Windows and doors at many armories were installed in the 1950s and 1960s as part of the original construction. Repairs and replacements are needed for many to improve energy efficiency, security, and quality of life at these facilities.

CAP-045	Plumbing Renovations (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$576,270
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Projects in Wayne, Licking, Coshocton, Franklin, and Stark counties.

Funds will be used to assess, repair and/or remove and replace existing plumbing systems, which have become degraded, unserviceable, and unable to accommodate current or future requirements. Kitchens, restrooms, and general plumbing and fixtures will be upgraded.

CAP-046	Paving Improvements (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$2,044,592
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Projects in Franklin and Summit counties.

Funds will be used to remove and replace the asphalt in the parking bt the Regional Training Institute at Rickenbacker Army Enclave, repave the road network around the Rickenbacker Army Enclave, and seal the asphalt ramp areas at Akron-Canton and Rickenbacker Airports with a special material suitable for aircraft refueling operations.

CAP-050	HVAC Systems Improvements (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$835,640
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Projects in Jefferson, Summit, and Franklin counties.

Funds will be used to assess, repair and/or remove and replace heating, ventilation, and air condition (HVAC) components and systems. Most of these systems were installed in the 1950s and 1960s and are no longer sufficient to meet day-to-day operations.

CAP-056	Masonry Renovations (Various - See Below)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$381,634
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Projects in Logan, Delaware, Wood, and Miami counties.

Funds will be used assess, repair, and renovation of interior and exterior masonry structural and cosmetic systems. Brick and block plaster as well as ornamental concrete and masonry has begun to reach critical repair and replacement levels.

CAP-057	Sewer Improvements -Rickenbacker (Franklin)	Renovation/ Replacement	\$180,000
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Funds will be used to repair the sanitary sewer system of the 121<sup>st</sup> Air Refueling Wing. Repairs include replacing manholes, excavating, repairing or replacing specific sections of sewer pipes, and replacing an existing lift station.

CAP-058	Construct Cincinnati Armory (Hamilton)	New Construction	\$1,701,295
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Funds will be used to acquire land, prepare the site, and cover architect and engineering fees for the construction of a 600 person basic armory. Federal moneys will fund 75 percent of the cost of constructing the armory. The 25 percent state share (approximately \$2.1 million) will come from the reappropriation of funds from Am. Sub. H.B. 850 of the 122<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly. These funds were originally appropriated for the renovation of the Shadybrook and Reading Road Armories, both located in Hamilton County. Both of these armories will be closed and

disposed of with the opening of the new armory. Five Army National Guard units will utilize the new facility. The release of state funds is contingent upon the certification that federal funds exist and are sufficient to cover construction costs.

CAP-059	Construct Bowling Green Armory (Wood)	New Construction	\$825,528
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Funds will be used to acquire land, prepare the site, and cover architect and engineering fees for the construction of a 150 person basic armory. Federal moneys will fund 75 percent of the cost of constructing the armory. The 25 percent state share (approximately \$875,000) will come from the reappropriation of funds from Am. Sub. H.B. 850 of the 122<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly. These funds were originally appropriated for repairs to the Hillsboro and Eaton Armories. The Adjutant General will make emergency repairs to these two armories and then use the remaining funds to make up the state share of construction costs for the new armory. Once the new armory is operational, the Adjutant General will close and dispose of both the Napoleon and old Bowling Green armory. One Army National Guard unit will utilize the new facility (currently this unit is split between two armories). The release of these state funds is contingent upon the certification that these federal funds exist and are sufficient to cover construction costs.
