ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING FUND (7026)

C05502 Bowling Green Facility **\$2,500,000**

County: Wood

This capital appropriation funds the second phase of a project intended to move the Bureau of Criminal Investigation's (BCI) Bowling Green office from its existing location in commercially leased space to a larger facility which will meet the increasing demand for laboratory and investigative services. Bowling Green State University (BGSU) is collaborating with BCI on the project. Phase II will complete the forensic lab casework, finish all interiors, and complete exteriors for building occupancy.

C05515 Data Center Renovations **\$4,005,941**

County: Multi-county - Madison, Summit

This capital appropriation funds renovations and upgrades to the server rooms located at the Bureau of Investigation (BCI) facilities in London and Richfield. The upgrades will allow for increased data storage capacity and enhanced power and cooling to the servers.

C05516 BCI London HVAC **\$1,126,543**

County: Madison

This capital appropriation will fund the replacement of three chillers at the Bureau of Investigation (BCI) laboratory in London. The current chillers were manufactured in 1999 and are at the end of their useful life cycle. Additionally, the refrigerant that is used in these particular models ceased production in 2010. The chillers will be replaced with more energy efficient units and will be less costly to maintain and repair in the future. Replacing and upgrading the HVAC control system at the BCI London facility will allow for better management of temperature and humidity in the laboratories. Environmental inconsistencies could negatively affect the laboratory's forensic casework.

C05517 General Building Renovations **\$200,000**

County: Statewide

This capital appropriation funds general renovation projects in the Office of the Attorney General's owned facilities. Several projects have been identified and include mitigating moisture and humidity problems in the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) dorm rooms, correcting water infiltration issues in the Bureau of Investigation (BCI) facility's windows, and relocating the polygraph area within BCI due to security concerns (all of which are located in London, Ohio). Capital funding for renovation and construction projects such as those listed above will substitute operating funds, which are utilized currently when these types of issues arise.

C05518 OPOTA TTC Shooting Range \$70,921
County: Madison

This capital appropriation funds the addition of sound attenuating baffles to the existing indoor/outdoor shooting range at the Ohio Peace Office Training Academy's (OPOTA) Tactical Training Center (TTC) in London. The appropriation will also fund waterproofing renovations to the roof of the range.

C05519 OPOTA TTC Simulators \$220,000
County: Madison

This capital appropriation will fund the replacement of two driving simulators located at the Ohio Peace Office Training Academy's (OPOTA) Tactical Training Center (TTC) in London. The TTC currently has three driving simulators, two of which are older models that are no longer covered by the manufacturer's warranty. Technical support and hardware are also no longer available. Driving simulators emphasize a focus on driving and avoiding multiple distractions. Students are also able to practice intersection clearing, route selection, steering technique, pedal use, eye placement, smooth inputs and Precision Immobilization Techniques (P.I.T.).

C05520 BCI London Garage Conversion \$387,246
County: Madison

This capital appropriation funds the conversion of space that was previously used as a maintenance garage at the Bureau of Investigation (BCI) in London, into a secure processing bay for large items of evidence, a meeting location for law enforcement, a space for the storage of expensive crime scene equipment and approximately 1,300 square feet of office space for the Crime Scene Unit. The maintenance garage is considered to be underutilized and its conversion will allow for BCI to increase its capacity, including the processing of large items of evidence that had been problematic in the past. The BCI facility in London serves 40 of Ohio's southern counties.
