Purpose: This fund pays for the administrative and regulatory operations of the Commission. On January 13, 1987, the Controlling Board increased the appropriation authority to allow for the payment of state racing judges' salaries. In Am. Sub. H.B. 298 of the 119th General Assembly, GRF funding was eliminated. Language was later added designating one quarter of one percent of the total of all moneys wagered on a racing day (excluding fairs and agricultural societies) to go to this fund in order to support the operating expenses formerly funded by the GRF.
