
Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill would permit the home school district of a student who graduates from the Ohio State School for the Blind (OSB) or the Ohio School for the Deaf (OSD) to grant him a diploma from the home district also.

Upon granting a diploma to a student, the superintendent of OSB or OSD would be required to provide notice of the student's receipt of the diploma to the board of education of his home school district. The notice would have to indicate the type of diploma granted.

Upon receipt of such notice by the home district's board of education that a student has received a diploma from either OSB or OSD, the board would be **permitted** to grant a high school diploma to the student. This diploma would be of the same type that the student has received from the state school.

However, the home district's board of education would be **required** to grant the student a diploma if he met the graduation requirements that he would otherwise have had to meet to receive a diploma from the home school district.

State fiscal effects

The state would incur no direct fiscal effect as a result of the bill.

Local fiscal effects

The direct fiscal effect on the school districts would be the administrative expenses of preparing the additional diplomas and would be minimal or none.
