Provisions of the bill

Under current law, townships are permitted to register transient vendors who seek to solicit within the township territory. The bill would allow townships to prohibit transient vending.

As under current law, the bill requires townships to notify the county prosecutor of any regulatory requirements on vendors. The bill eliminates the requirements that the county prosecutor be notified of the names of registered transient vendors and that the board of elections of the office of the Secretary of State be notified about regulatory requirements for transient vendors.

Fiscal Effects

Under the bill counties could have increased costs in order to prosecute violators of township resolutions that prohibit transient vending. County costs could be minimal.

Also, townships that choose to pass such resolutions could have increased costs to enforce them. Township costs could vary depending upon the measures a township chooses to take to enforce any transient vending prohibitions.
