State Fiscal Highlights

Local Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

Detailed Fiscal Analysis

Under current law, a Highway Patrol trooper must be at least 21 years of age but under the age of 35 when appointed as a trooper. The bill provides that a person attending training school for prospective troopers who attains the age of 35 may not be disqualified for over age. Additionally, the bill has an emergency clause to provide for an immediate effective date. The bill has no apparent direct fiscal effect, but should subsequent legislative action alter this conclusion, a revised fiscal note will be issued at that time.
