LOCAL IMPACT STATEMENT REQUIRED: No — No local cost

CONTENTS: Provides immunity from civil liability for certain nonprofit corporations and special districts when a hydrant controlled by them fails to provide either sufficient water or pressure to suppress a fire.

- There will be no increase of either revenues or expenditures for regional water and sewer districts. The possibility exists for the avoidance of potential expenditures that could have risen from civil suits. The provision of immunity from civil liability would now protect such districts in controversies regarding the insufficient supply of either water or water pressure to fire hydrants.

Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill has no apparent direct fiscal effect on the state or on any of its political subdivisions other than regional water and sewer districts. If subsequent legislative action should alter this conclusion, a revised fiscal note will be issued.
