



on the ballot on the same date as a general or primary election. Ballot language may reflect that this measure is a renewal of existing levies.

This bill will not add additional costs to the state or any political subdivisions. Counties and school districts may see potential savings in election-related costs from not having to place levies on the ballot as often. During a general election, the county is responsible for election-associated costs. While during a special election, the school district would split the costs of holding the election with the agencies with issues on the ballot at that time. This bill may make it easier for school districts to pass a renewal levy, as it will be clear to voters whether a levy is for a new tax or for the renewal of an existing tax.

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
