CONTENTS:     **Requires the Legislative Budget Office to prepare a community impact analysis for each bill or resolution requiring the relocation of state offices or employees**

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## ***State Fiscal Highlights***

- The minimal increased workload for the Legislative Budget Office will not likely increase its costs. Given the low frequency of bills or resolutions that require the relocation of state offices or employees, this bill is not expected to have any direct fiscal effect.

## ***Local Fiscal Highlights***

- No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.
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## ***Detailed Fiscal Analysis***

This bill would require the Legislative Budget Office (LBO) to prepare a community impact analysis for each bill or resolution that requires the relocation of state offices or employees. An explanation of the bill's economic, financial, and employment impacts would be included in the LBO analysis, together with any other information LBO deemed necessary to describe the community impact. LBO would be required to submit the community impact analysis prior to the appropriate committee's vote and again before the bill or resolution had a floor vote in both houses.

The bill is not likely to affect LBO's costs, due to the low frequency of such relocation bills. For example, during this and the last General Assembly, there were no more than a handful of bills that required the relocation of state offices and employees. LBO's current resources should be sufficient to prepare the community impact statements.
