State Fiscal Highlights

- As the bill codifies the existing practices of correctional institutions in Ohio, its prohibition provision produces no direct fiscal effects on the state.

Local Fiscal Highlights

- As the bill codifies existing practices of local correctional institutions, its prohibition provision produces no direct fiscal effects on local governments.



Detailed Fiscal Analysis

Provisions of the Bill

The bill codifies what is current practice in Ohio public and private correctional institutions, prohibiting prisoner access to the Internet.

Fiscal Effects of the Bill

Because this bill codifies existing practice prohibiting prisoners in state and local correctional facilities from having access to the Internet, its provisions will not create any new or additional costs. No additional staff will be needed and no additional procedural requirements are mandated.
