## *Detailed Fiscal Analysis*

The bill permits townships to regulate the resale of tickets to theatrical, sporting, or other public amusements. Any violation is an unspecified minor misdemeanor with a maximum fine of \$100.

Counties and municipalities could have additional court and enforcement costs for any permissive regulations passed by townships resulting in minor misdemeanor offenses or civil cases from private persons. The bill could also generate court fee revenue from such cases, but not fine revenue, which would go to the affected township. Typically, fine revenue from a state statutory offense would go to the county.

Townships that choose to adopt regulations under the expanded authority provided in the bill could have additional enforcement costs and could gain additional fine revenue from any violators fined under the regulations.
