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## Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill creates the Hemophilia Advisory Council in the Department of Health and specifies the membership and duties of the Council. One of the duties required by the bill is that the Council annually submit to the Governor and General Assembly a report with recommendations on increasing access to care and treatment and obtaining appropriate health insurance coverage for persons with hemophilia and related bleeding disorders. The bill specifies that members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

The Department will likely realize an increase in costs relating to member reimbursements and administrative duties Department staff employ in support of the Council. LSC assumes that these costs will be minimal. The threshold for a minimal cost determination is \$100,000 per year.
