## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Contents:** Reduces the number of members on the Optical Dispensers Board and eliminates the age requirement for the public member serving on the Board

### State Fiscal Highlights

- The Board may realize savings of approximately \$2,500 per year related to Board member compensation and travel reimbursement.

### Local Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

## Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill reduces the number of members serving on the Optical Dispensers Board from nine to seven and adjusts the composition of the Board. This may result in savings for the Board of approximately \$2,500 each year related to Board member compensation and travel reimbursement. On average, Board members receive approximately \$800 in compensation for conducting official Board business each year. Board members also receive travel reimbursement of approximately \$450 per year.

The bill proposes that the Board be composed of five licensed dispensing opticians, at least one of whom is a licensed contact lens dispensing optician and at least one of whom is a licensed spectacle dispensing optician, one licensed optometrist or authorized physician who engages in the practice of ophthalmology, and one member of the public. The bill eliminates the requirement that the public member serving on the Board be at least 60 years of age. The bill also reduces the concurrence requirements from five to four for Board action to be considered valid.
