

Local Impact Statements for Bills Enacted with “Yes” Determination “As Introduced”

The following chart lists all 20 bills passed in 1999 that became law and were designated with “Yes” local impact determinations in their “As Introduced” form.

HB 185	Institutes alternative method for apportioning LGF and LGRAF	C, M, T
HB 194	Exempts from taxation residential real property constructed, rehabilitated owned by nonprofit charitable organizations...	C, M, T, SD
HB 197	Authorizes the Ohio EPA to issue permits and regulate the use, storage, treatment, or disposal of sludge and sludge materials	C, M, T
HB 428	Revises the state controlled substances schedules according to federal drug laws	C
HB 470	OBES and DHS Merger Bill	C, M
SB 1	Requires each school district board of education to adopt a comprehensive school safety plan	C, S, D
SB 4	Grants a nonrefundable credit against the personal income tax to persons who adopt children	C, M, T
SB 9	Requires the court to consider certain aggravating factors in determining the sentence of specified violent offenders	C, M
SB 22	Establishes stricter penalties for OMVI offenders who test with a concentration of .17 of one gram or more by weight of alcohol	C, M
SB 98	Prohibits the affixing of tax stamps to certain packages of cigarettes and declares an emergency	C, M Cuyahoga County
SB 107	Clarifies and modifies certain provisions of the Controlled Substance Law and Drug Abuse Law	C, M
SB 164	Adds 1 additional judge for the 5th and 11th District Court of Appeals; and 2 judges to the Summit County Court of Common Pleas	Certain Counties

These two bills started with a “No” in their “As introduced” form, but were changed to add local effects.

HB 162	Enhances penalties under the offense of child endangerment when death of serious physical harm occurs to the victim; creates the offense of permitting child abuse.	C, M
HB 384	Changes to the Mine Examining Board, requirement for on site, first aid providers to the surface mines, and repeals certain provisions of the Revised Code involving weighing and measuring and explosions at coal mines. Increases the coal usage tax credit from \$1 per ton to \$3 per ton, and allows some additional usage to qualify for the credit.	C, M, T
