

Veterans' Organizations

- The total funding for all organizations is \$2,867,250 for the biennium.
- Funding levels remain constant for FYs 2002 and 2003.

OVERVIEW

The State of Ohio currently grants subsidies to 15 different organizations that serve Ohio's veterans. The primary mission of all of these organizations is to promote and provide assistance to veterans in Ohio. These groups educate veterans and their dependents on the various benefits available to them. Some of the organizations provide emergency assistance. All of the various veterans' organizations promote the remembrance of their fellow veterans and the wars they fought.

All 15 veterans' organizations receive a GRF subsidy. In addition to state funding, each organization provides much of its own funding through federal grants, membership dues, fund-raising efforts, and private donations.

The total proposed funding for the Veterans' Organizations is \$1,433,625 in FY2002 and \$1,433,625 in FY2003. The Veterans' Organizations, for the most part, received the same funding levels as in FY 2001. The only major change in funding was for the American Veterans of World War II. The fund received \$887,919 in 2001 and \$237,919 in both FY 2002 and 2003. This reduction is due to a one-time contribution to the National World War II Memorial made in FY 2001.

ADDITIONAL FACTS AND FIGURES

According to the Plain Dealer Bureau (February 2, 2001), Ohio returned more than \$400,000 set aside by the federal government to assist veterans in 2000. This was due to a lack of Veterans Specialists hired by the Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services. These positions were unfilled even though the wages and benefits of the specialists are paid by the U.S. Department of Labor. The same amount of federal funds are likely to be lost in May of this year due to 18 Veterans Specialists vacancies.

VETERAN'S ORGANIZATIONS

Program Description: No specific statutory reference establishes this group or requires that a subsidy be granted to it.

Funding Source: GRF

Line Items: The line items for the Veterans' Organizations are listed above.

Implication of Recommendation: The Executive recommended that the funding of the Veteran's Organizations remain steady from FY 2001 to FY 2003 with few decreases and no increases in funding. The total appropriation for 2002 decreases by 31.2% from 2001. A large portion of this decrease is due to the one-time contribution of \$500,000 in FY 2001 to the National World War II Memorial Fund. This was given to the American Veterans of WWII-Korea-Vietnam fund. Another smaller decrease affects the Veterans of World War I. The fund received \$24,780 in FYs 2002 and 2003, which is \$251 or 1% less than their appropriations in FY 2001.

PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY LAW

This section describes permanent and temporary law provisions contained in the executive budget that will affect the department's activities and spending decisions during the next biennium.

Temporary Law Provisions

Release of Funds (Section 106 of the bill)

The foregoing appropriation items 743-501, 746-501, 747-501, 748-501, 749-501, 750-501, 751-501, 752-501, 753-501, 754-501, 755-501, 756-501, 757-501, 758-501, and 759-501, State Support, shall be released upon approval by the Director of Budget and Management.

American Ex-Prisoners of War (Section 106 of the bill)

The American Ex-Prisoners of War shall be permitted to share an office with the Veterans of World War I.

Funds for Central Ohio USO (Section 106 of the bill)

\$50,000 of the Vietnam Veterans of America (item 751-501) fund is earmarked to support the activities of the Central Ohio USO. This earmark is for each year of the biennium.

Veterans Service Commission Education (Section 106 of the bill)

Of the foregoing appropriation item 753-501, State Support, American Veterans of WWII, up to \$20,000 in each fiscal year may be used to provide money to the Association of County Veterans Service Commissioners to reimburse county veterans service commissions for costs incurred while carrying out educational and outreach duties required under divisions (E) and (F) of section 5901.03 of the Revised Code. The Office of Veterans Affairs shall direct the Auditor of State to reimburse commissions for reasonable expenses incurred while performing these duties after receiving an itemized statement. The association shall establish uniform procedures for reimbursing member commissions.

REQUESTS NOT FUNDED

The Executive recommendations funded a portion of the total request made by the Veterans' Organizations. For FY 2002, the total request was for \$1,650,458 and the Executive proposed \$1,433,625. For FY 2003, the Veterans' requested \$1,797,240, while the Executive funded \$1,433,625. The Executive did not fund \$200,202 in FY 2002 and \$332,847 in FY 2003 for a total of \$533,049.
