# Ohio Board of Dietetics

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- The Executive recommends \$334,917 in FY 2004 (a 5.4% increase over estimated FY 2003 expenditures) and \$329,687 in FY 2005 (a 1.6% decrease over the FY 2005 recommended appropriation)
- 3,322 licensees in FY 2002

## OVERVIEW

The Ohio Board of Dietetics, created in 1987, protects and regulates the practice of dietetics in Ohio. The Board consists of five members and has three full-time employees.

The Board issues two types of licenses: dietitian and limited permit dietitian. In FY 2002, the Board licensed 3,196 dietitians and 126 limited permits. The total number of licensees increased by 6% between FY 2001 and FY 2002.

Revenue is generated from new and renewal license fees, which are collected annually. Expenditures are for operating expenses associated with the licensure, regulation, and enforcement processes. Revenues and expenditures for FY 2002 totaled \$270,293 and \$262,125, respectively. The Board contributed \$8,168 more to Fund 4K9 than it expended during the renewal cycle.

### Dietetic Technicians

The Board states that dietetic technicians are seeking licensure. According to the Board's estimates, licensing dietetic technicians would increase the number of licenses issued by approximately 700. If dietetic technicians were granted licensure, the Board would seek Controlling Board approval to hire a part-time clerical/investigation position (0.5 FTE) to manage the increased workload. There are no provisions in the Executive budget regarding dietetic technicians.

### Licensing System

The occupational licensing boards, in partnership with the Department of Administrative Services, are working to implement a new licensing system. The system will be phased in over the next biennium and each board will pay their share of the costs out of Fund 4K9. The Board of Dietetics will pay an annual fee of approximately \$3,000 during the next biennium and a monthly fee of approximately \$1,000.

### Administrative Fees

During the current biennium, boards absorbed increased administrative costs charged by other state agencies. Many boards contracted for services that were once provided by other state agencies.

The Board estimates that increased administrative fees will cost the Board approximately \$15,500 in FY 2004 and \$16,000 in FY 2005 for DAS Central Service Agency fees, computer technical support, license renewal banking and revenue processing fees, and risk management fees to administer the Board's public employee fidelity bond in the current biennium.

**Fee Changes**

Since 1993, the Board has brought in enough revenue to offset expenditures. However, the Board states that FY 2003 expenditures will outweigh revenues by approximately \$38,000. Originally, the Board sought fee increases for the FY 2004 renewal cycle. However, the Board received notification that the American Dietetic Association, of which approximately 3,000 of the 3,100 dietitian licensees in Ohio belong, will increase their member dues in FY 2004. The Board feels that raising licensure fees in FY 2004 would produce a severe economic hardship on Ohio's dietitians. After reevaluating the Board's Fund 4K9 reserves, the Board believes that there will be enough reserve revenue to cover FY 2004 expenditures. However, the Board will institute fee increases for the FY 2005 renewal cycle. The Executive budget includes the fee increases.

## ANALYSIS OF EXECUTIVE PROPOSAL

### Ohio Board of Dietetics

**Program Description:** In accordance with Chapter 4759. of the Revised Code, the Ohio Board of Dietetics protects the health and safety of Ohio citizens by regulating the practice of dietetics by setting and enforcing the standards of practice through annual licensure requirements, and investigating complaints against unlawful dietetic practices.

**Funding Source:** General Services Fund Group (Fund 4K9). Currently, all revenue from 24 occupational licensing boards is placed in Fund 4K9 and reallocated to each board. Each board must raise enough revenue through its license fees to cover its expenses.

**Line Item:** 860-609, Operating Expenses

**Implication of the Executive Recommendation:** The executive recommendation will allow the Board to continue current service levels and cover the Board's increased administrative fees. The executive recommendation includes an appropriation of \$334,917 for FY 2004, which represents an increase of 5.4% over estimated FY 2003 expenditures. The Executive recommends an appropriation of \$329,687 for FY 2005, which is a decrease of 1.6% from FY 2004 recommended appropriations.

No new initiatives are planned with the recommended funding. The Board will be able to replace two computers and print approximately 4,000 revised law books in FY 2004, and can purchase file stacks in FY 2005.

## PERMANENT AND TEMPORARY LAW

This section describes permanent and temporary law provisions contained in the executive budget that will affect the Board's activities and spending decisions during the next biennium.

### Permanent Law Provisions

#### Fee Increases (R.C. section 4759.08)

As proposed in the biennium budget bill, the following fee increases would go into effect on July 1, 2004:

If these fee changes are not enacted, the Board estimates that it will be in negative standing in Fund 4K9 by FY 2005. The fee increases will ensure that the Board can bring in enough revenue to offset expenditures.

**Legal Basis:** ORC 4743.05 (originally established by Am. Sub. H.B. 570 of the 116th G.A.)

**Purpose:** This appropriation supports the general operating expenses, including payroll, supplies, and equipment for the Ohio Board of Dietetics. The board licenses and regulates the dietetic profession in Ohio.

**Subject: State Vision Board Created, Combination of Optometry and Optical Dispensers Boards**

No provision.

R.C. 4725.01, 125.22, 4725.02-4725.13, 4725.15-4725.17, 4725.171, 4725.18-4725.24, 4725.26-4725.29, 4725.31, 4725.33, 4725.34, 4725.99, 4734.99, 5903.12, Section 110a

Creates the Ohio Vision Board, effective July 31, 2003, eliminating the Board of Optometry and the Optical Dispensers Board and combining their functions under the Vision Board.

Fiscal effect: The Ohio Vision Board is appropriated \$550,000 in each fiscal year. This is \$63,236 less than the appropriation for the Board of Optometry and the Optical Dispensers Board in fiscal year 2004 and \$87,047 less in fiscal year 2005. Revenue deposited in the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Fund (Fund 4K9) will remain unchanged. The provision could result in savings by reducing duplication in office operations. However, the extent of the savings depends on future decisions (e.g., number of employees, etc.). There could be one-time administrative costs associated office reorganization (e.g., office space, moving expenses, storage, etc.).

**Subject: Optical Dispensers Board Fees Determined by Rule**

R.C. 4725.44, 4725.45, 4725.48, 4725.50, 4725.51,  
4725.52, 4725.57

Eliminates the amounts specified in statute for fees charged by the Optical Dispensers Board and provides for the amounts to be specified by the Board in rules adopted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (R.C. Chapter 119.). Any such fee changes must be approved by the Controlling board and cannot exceed the previous amounts by more than 50%. Clarifies provisions for the endorsement of out-of-state licenses and the licensure of ocularists.
