



## *Synopsis of House Committee Amendments*\*

### **Sub. S.B. 208**

124th General Assembly  
(H. Criminal Justice)

Requires a law enforcement officer's substantial compliance with field sobriety test standards be established by clear and convincing evidence.

Revises the bill's provisions regarding whether the bill limits or precludes a court, in its determination of any matter in a criminal prosecution or juvenile court proceeding of a type described in the bill, from considering evidence of a certain type to specify that the bill does not limit or preclude a court, in determining such matters, from considering evidence or testimony that is not otherwise disallowed by the bill's provisions.

Expands the scope of the bill so that it also applies to Watercraft OMVI and OMVUAC and Implied Consent and the offense of "having physical control of a vehicle while under the influence."

Amends the versions of the bill's sections that take effect January 1, 2004, and makes other technical changes.
