



*Synopsis of House Committee Amendments**

(H. State Government Committee)

Modifies the Senate-passed version's electric personal assistive mobility device provisions by making various technical and clarifying changes, including (among others) a change clarifying that an offender who previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to a violation of any of the prohibitions relating to a device's operation is (similar to a first-time offender) guilty of minor misdemeanor and must be fined \$10 (secs. 4511.512 and 4511.99(Q)(1)).

Adds to the Senate-passed version a provision to specify in the Secured Transactions that the sale, pledge, assignment, or granting of a security interest in all or any part of a lottery prize award for consideration is subject to (1) the State Lottery Law's *prohibition* against a lottery prize award being the subject of a security interest or being used as collateral and (2) the provisions of a pending act (Sub. S.B. 226) that, if it becomes law, will permit certain transfers of lottery prize awards pursuant to a transfer agreement and upon the prior approval of a court of competent jurisdiction (sec. 1309.109(E)).
