



## *Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments\**

### **Sub. H.B. 267**

127th General Assembly  
(S. Health, Human Services & Aging)

#### **Mayor's courts**

Adds provisions to the bill that modify the existing laws governing the operation of mayor's courts by doing all of the following:

- Changing the population criteria that must be met by a municipal corporation to operate a mayor's court by (1) raising to 200 (from 100) the minimum population requirement, (2) establishing a maximum population requirement of 45,000, and (3) exempting Put-in-Bay in Ottawa County from both the minimum and maximum population requirements;
- Requiring that a mayor's court be conducted by an attorney;
- Authorizing the Attorney General to seek an injunction against a mayor's court that is operating illegally.

#### **Prison health professional loan repayment program**

Adds optometrists and psychologists to the House-passed provisions of the bill that expand the types of health professionals who may be recruited through an educational loan repayment program operated by the Department of Rehabilitation and Correction.

#### **Correctional Institution Inspection Committee**

Removes the House-passed provisions of the bill regarding the Correctional Institution Inspection Committee that would have (1) increased the Committee's membership from 8 to 12, and (2) provided that the records and work products of the Committee and its staff are confidential.
