Synopsis of House Committee Amendments*

129th General Assembly

(H. Transportation, Public Safety, & Homeland Security)

In regard to memorial highway designation by the Director of Transportation:

- Allows the Director of Transportation to designate portions of state highways in honor of each state highway patrol trooper killed in the line of duty, rather than requiring such action as in the version passed by the Senate;
- Removes the Senate-passed provision requiring the Director to designate local roads as memorial highways for each county sheriff or deputy sheriff, township constable or township police officer, or municipal police officer killed in the line of duty.

Makes the following memorial or other highway designations:

- The "Branch Rickey Memorial Highway," a portion of United States Route 23, within Scioto County.
- The "Sfc. Charles L. Adkins Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 101 in Erie County.
- The "Specialist Charles E. Odums II Memorial Highway," a portion of United States Route 250 in Sandusky.
- The "David A. Gibson Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 104 in Ross County.
- The "U.S. Army Specialist Allen Nolan Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 676 in Washington County.
- The "Marine Corporal Paul W. Zanowick II Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 725 in Montgomery County.

* This synopsis does not address amendments that may have been adopted on the House Floor.

- The "Pfc. Jeffrey L. Rice Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 55 in Miami County.
- The "Boone Coleman Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 52 in Scioto County.
- The "Bill Burgett Highway," a portion of State Route 13 in Knox County.
- The "Cpl. Nicholas H. Olivas Memorial Highway," a portion of State Route 128 in Butler County.
