# State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors

- Budget of \$993,889 in each fiscal year
- Revenues tend to be higher in even-numbered fiscal years due to biennial renewal cycle

#### **OVERVIEW**

### **Agency Overview**

The State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors (ENG) regulates the professions of engineering and surveying to protect the public by ensuring that only properly qualified individuals and businesses become registered, and that the registrants follow the established standards and codes of ethics. Approximately 28,000 professional engineers and surveyors as well as almost 2,800 firms are licensed in the state. ENG's governing body consists of five members appointed by the Governor, including four professional engineers (one of whom must also be a professional surveyor) and one professional surveyor. The Board must meet at least twice per year but generally meets about seven times per year. Members receive a per diem amount fixed by state law when attending to Board matters and are reimbursed for expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties. ENG's day-to-day operations are handled by an executive director and nine full-time staff.

# **Appropriation Overview**

The budget provides \$993,889 in each fiscal year for ENG operations, which is a 22.1% increase compared to FY 2015 spending of \$814,268. ENG receives no GRF funding; rather, it is entirely supported by licensing and application fees that are deposited into the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Fund (Fund 4K90).

# **Operating Revenues**

The primary source of operating income for the occupational licensing boards is licensing fees. Table 1 shows the current fees charged by ENG.

Fees collected by ENG are deposited into the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Fund (Fund 4K90). Twenty-six occupational licensing and regulatory boards and commissions, including ENG, use Fund 4K90 as an operating account into which receipts are deposited and from which expenses are paid. Although Fund 4K90 is a shared operating pool, each licensing board or commission is expected to be self-sufficient by generating enough income to cover expenses. Table 2 below shows ENG's operating revenue and expenditure history from FY 2010 to FY 2015. Because of the change to a biennial license renewal cycle beginning in FY 2012, receipts for that year increased by just over \$600,000 to \$1.7 million when compared to FY 2011 collections of \$1.1 million. Subsequently, FY 2013 revenue decreased to \$600,000. In the FY 2014-FY 2015 biennium, revenues outpaced expenditures by nearly \$685,000, an increase of over \$100,000 (17.3%) from the FY 2012-FY 2013 biennium.

### **ANALYSIS OF ENACTED BUDGET**

ENG's operations are funded by a single line item appropriation within the Occupational Licensing and Regulatory Fund (Fund 4K90). The table below shows the appropriation for the line item.

This appropriation item supports all of ENG's operating expenses, including activities related to licensing, investigations, and enforcement. The budget appropriates \$993,889 in both FY 2016 and FY 2017, a 22.1% increase compared to FY 2015 spending of \$814,268.

#### Licenses

Table 3 shows the number of active registrations issued by ENG as of the end of FY 2013, FY 2014, and FY 2015. As the table shows, the total number of active registrations decreased slightly between FY 2013 and FY 2014, with the exception of firms. Firm registrations increased by over 20%, mostly attributable to improving economic conditions. In FY 2015, the number of active registrations increased at a higher rate across all registration types.

## **Investigation and Enforcement Statistics**

In addition to licensing, ENG investigates complaints and alleged violations of Chapter 4733. of the Revised Code, the statute governing the engineering and surveying professions. As Table 4 below shows, ENG investigated 93 complaints in FY 2015.
