OVERVIEW

Agency Overview

The primary purpose of the Ohio Commission on Hispanic/Latino Affairs (OCHLA) is to advise the Governor, General Assembly, and state agencies on policies focusing on the special issues and needs of Ohio's Spanish-speaking population. The governing authority consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor. Of the 11 members, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate each recommend two for appointment, and the minority leaders of the House and Senate each recommend one for appointment. Members are required to be of Latino heritage and to be able to speak minimal Spanish. OCHLA's daily operations are the responsibility of an executive director, appointed by the governing authority, and three full-time and two part-time employees.

Appropriation Overview

The budget provides funding of close to \$440,000 in each fiscal year, a 14.0% increase compared to FY 2015 spending of approximately \$385,000. This funding increase is mostly attributable to a recent decision by the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to charge rent to executive branch agencies, boards, and commissions that occupy space in state office buildings and receive funding from the General Revenue Fund (GRF). OCHLA, a tenant of the Riffe Center in downtown Columbus with over 94% GRF funding, expects to pay \$28,000 in rent in FY 2016 and FY 2017.

Personal Services (148100)

This line item supports OCHLA's personnel expenses for the Public Policy Center, Latino Community Network, and Organizations Development Center as well as OCHLA's other operational expenses, which include computer software and hardware upgrades, rent, and supplies. For this line item, the budget provides nearly \$370,000 in each fiscal year, an 8.2% increase when compared to FY 2015 spending of about \$340,000. This funding increase will mostly be used by OCHLA to pay rent on the office space it currently occupies in the Riffe Center.

Community Programs (148402)

This line item supports various initiatives involving community projects geared toward Latino populations in the state. Historically, these outreach activities have been conducted in eight regions throughout the state: Toledo, Fremont, Lorain, Cleveland, Youngstown, Columbus, Dayton, and Cincinnati. The budget provides funding of approximately \$45,000 in each fiscal year, an increase of nearly \$10,000 when compared to FY 2015 spending. OCHLA will be able to maintain the Ohio Latino Affairs Network (OLAnet) database system, which helps to enhance economic growth, connect Latino communities, and provide information and news about Latino events statewide.

Special Initiatives (148602)

This line item mostly supports expenses related to the annual Distinguished Hispanic Ohioan Award Gala. The budget provides nearly \$25,000 in each fiscal year for this line item, an increase of over \$16,000 compared to FY 2015 spending.
