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## OHIO DEAF AND BLIND EDUCATION SERVICES

- Permits a student enrolled in the State School for the Deaf or State School for the Blind to qualify for a high school diploma by completing a high school curriculum in lieu of completing the student's individualized education program (IEP).
- Requires investment earnings on money in each state school's educational program expense fund to be credited to that fund.

### High school diploma requirements

(R.C. 3325.08)

To qualify for a high school diploma under continuing law, a student enrolled in the State School for the Deaf or Blind must complete the student's IEP, in addition to completing the other high school graduation requirements established for public school students.

Under the act, in lieu of completing an IEP to qualify for a diploma, a student may complete any high school's curriculum.

### Expense funds investment earnings

(R.C. 3325.16 and 3325.17)

The act requires that all investment earnings on money in each state school's educational program expenses fund to be credited to that fund.
