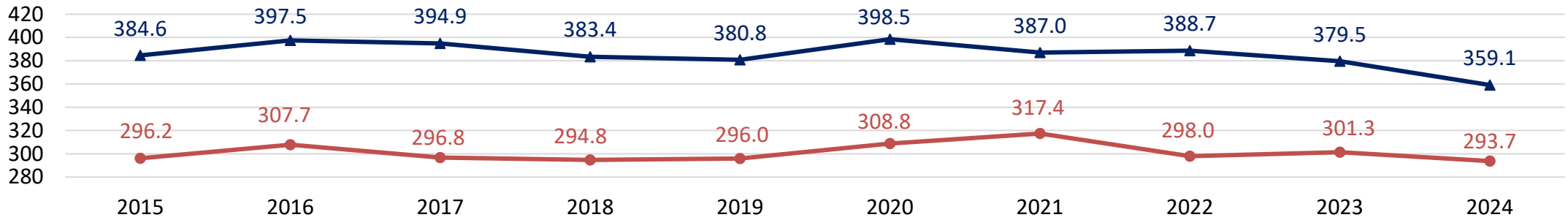


Ohio's Violent and Property Crime Rates



Ohio's violent crime rate decreases at a lower rate than the national average

Ohio's Violent Crime Rate per 100,000 People, by Year



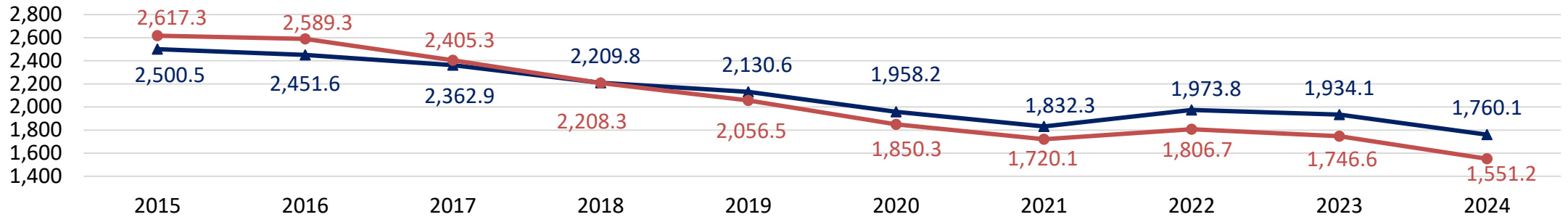

- The 2024 violent crime rate for both the nation and Ohio decreased from 2023. However, the rate of decrease for Ohio, 2.5%, was lower than the national rate of decrease, 5.4%. FBI crime rates are subject to revision and may change slightly as law enforcement agencies continue to submit data.
- Ohio's violent crime rate has remained consistently below the national average over the past ten years. In 2024, compared to the national average, Ohio's violent crime rate was 18.2% lower.
- In 2024, Ohio's violent crime totaled 34,898 reported incidences, of which 23,462 (67.2%) were aggravated assaults, 5,435 (15.6%) were rapes, 5,403 (15.5%) were robberies, and 598 (1.7%) were homicides. A total of 641 law enforcement agencies reported data to the FBI, covering approximately 93% of Ohio's population. A single incident may involve multiple offenses.
- Of the surrounding five states, Ohio has a higher violent crime rate in 2024 per 100,000 people than West Virginia, Pennsylvania and Kentucky.

Ohio's property crime rate continues downward trend in line with the national average

- Both Ohio's property crime rate and the national property crime rate decreased from 2023 to 2024, with Ohio's rate of decrease, 11.2%, exceeding the national rate of decrease, 9.0%. Ohio's property crime rate, as measured by the estimate of larceny-theft, burglary, and motor vehicle theft per 100,000 people, was nearly 12.0% lower than the national average in 2024. Ohio's property crime rate has remained below the national rate since 2018.
- In 2024, Ohio's property crime totaled 184,339 incidences, of which 134,610 (73.0%) were larceny-theft, 25,252 (13.7%) were motor vehicle theft, and 24,477 (13.3%) were burglary. A total of 641 law enforcement agencies reported data to the FBI, covering approximately 93% of Ohio's population. A single incident may involve multiple offenses.
- Of the surrounding five states, Ohio had the highest property crime rate per 100,000 people.
