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Education Laws and Community Schools

Community schools (often called “charter schools”) are public schools that operate independently from school districts. They are exempt from many of the state education laws, such as a required course of study to be offered by the school and teacher employment and contract requirements. For some requirements, such as minimum school year, community schools must comply with provisions of law specific only to those types of schools. However, community schools also are subject to many state education laws, such as state assessments, graduation and diploma requirements, and health and safety standards.

This brief lists education laws from which community schools are exempt and those from which they are not exempt.

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Introduction

Authorized in R.C. Chapter 3314, community schools (often called “charter schools”) are public, nonprofit, nonsectarian schools that operate independently of any school district but under a contract with a sponsoring entity. The schools often serve a limited number of grades or a particular purpose. Conversion community schools may be sponsored by and operate in any school district in the state. Start-up community schools are new schools that may operate in any school district. The schools are directly financed with state funds. Many community schools are run by separate, private for-profit or nonprofit operators.

Community schools are exempt from many of the state’s education laws.¹ Table 1 lists requirements that apply to school districts but from which community schools are exempt. Table 2 lists school district mandates that specifically also apply to community schools. The table

does not include requirements related to community school governance, location, and sponsorship.

This brief has been prepared for legislators as an overview of state policy. It is not intended to constitute legal advice to community schools, their sponsors, or any other parties. The staff of the Legislative Service Commission plans to update this brief biennially.

² School districts must offer certain community schools and STEM schools the right of first refusal to purchase district real property. If district-owned real property has not been used for one year, the district must offer it for sale or lease to certain community schools and STEM schools. The law also prohibits a community school or STEM school from selling property purchased from a school district within five years of purchasing it, unless that sale is to another community school or STEM school located in the district.

³ Community schools, like school districts, may make up calamity days by adopting a plan to provide instruction via online delivery (R.C. 3313.482). Nevertheless, the Department of Education and Workforce must waive the number of hours or days of learning opportunities not offered by a community school because it was closed due to a public calamity, so long as the school was actually open for instruction with students in attendance for at least the minimum number of hours required by law, which is currently 920 hours (R.C. 3314.08(H)(4)).
