## FY 2023 Medical Marijuana **Patient and Caregiver Registry Statistics**

On December 3, 2018, the State Board of Pharmacy activated the Ohio Medical Marijuana Control Program (MMCP) Patient and Caregiver Registry. The Registry allows certified physicians to register patients and caregivers and to issue recommendations for the use of medical marijuana. Patients and caregivers are then able to use the system to complete registration for a medical marijuana patient registry card, update registration information, and pay the required annual fee. All reported statistics are as of June 30, 2023.

#### 3 Steps to Legally Obtain Medical Marijuana

To obtain medical marijuana through the MMCP, a person must complete the following three steps:



Receive a recommendation from a certified physician confirming that a person has a qualifying medical condition



## **Registered Patients and Caregivers**



#### **Indigent Status**

6.2% (23,405) of registered patients qualified for indigent status. Indigent applicants are eligible have to registration fee reduced by

In FY 2023, patient and caregiver registration fees totaled

#### **Veteran Status**

5.9% (22,342) of registered patients qualified for veteran status. Veteran applicants are eligible to have their registration fee reduced by 50%.


#### Terminal Diagnosis

0.4% (1,346) of registered patients had a terminal diagnosis meaning a qualifying medical condition for which a patient prospective received a diagnosis for a life expectancy of six months or less if the illness runs its normal course.

The annual cost of a medical marijuana registration is \$50 for patients and \$25 for caregivers, subject to reductions for indigent or veteran status. The money is credited to the Medical Marijuana Control Program Fund (Fund 5SYo), along with fees collected to issue licenses to MMCP dispensaries, cultivators, processors, and testing laboratories. The fund is used by the Board of Pharmacy and the Department of Commerce to pay for their respective operating costs in administering the MMCP.

### Number of Registered Patients Recommended by Qualifying Medical Condition

Of the 377,384 registered patients in June 2023, many had multiple qualifying conditions.
