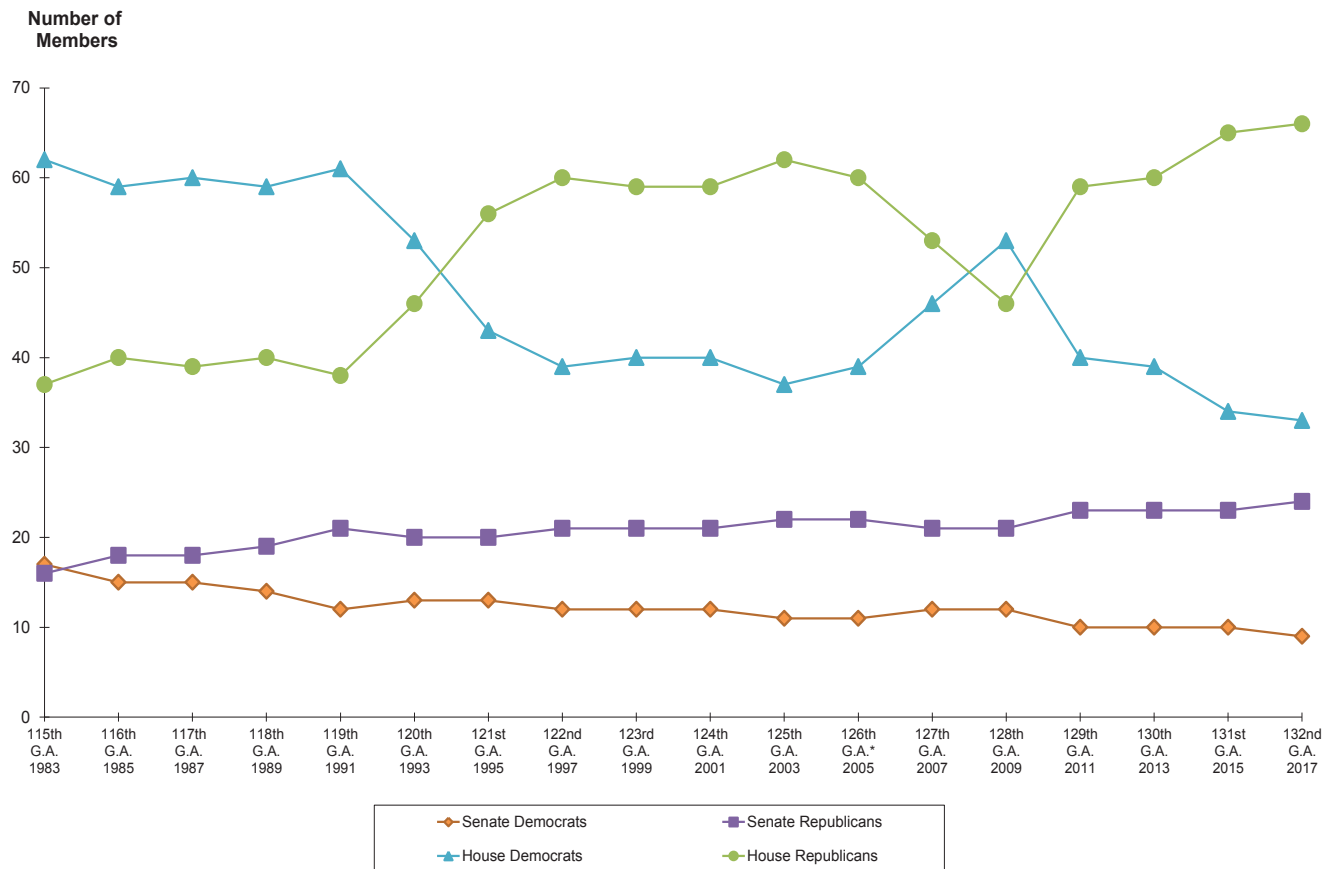




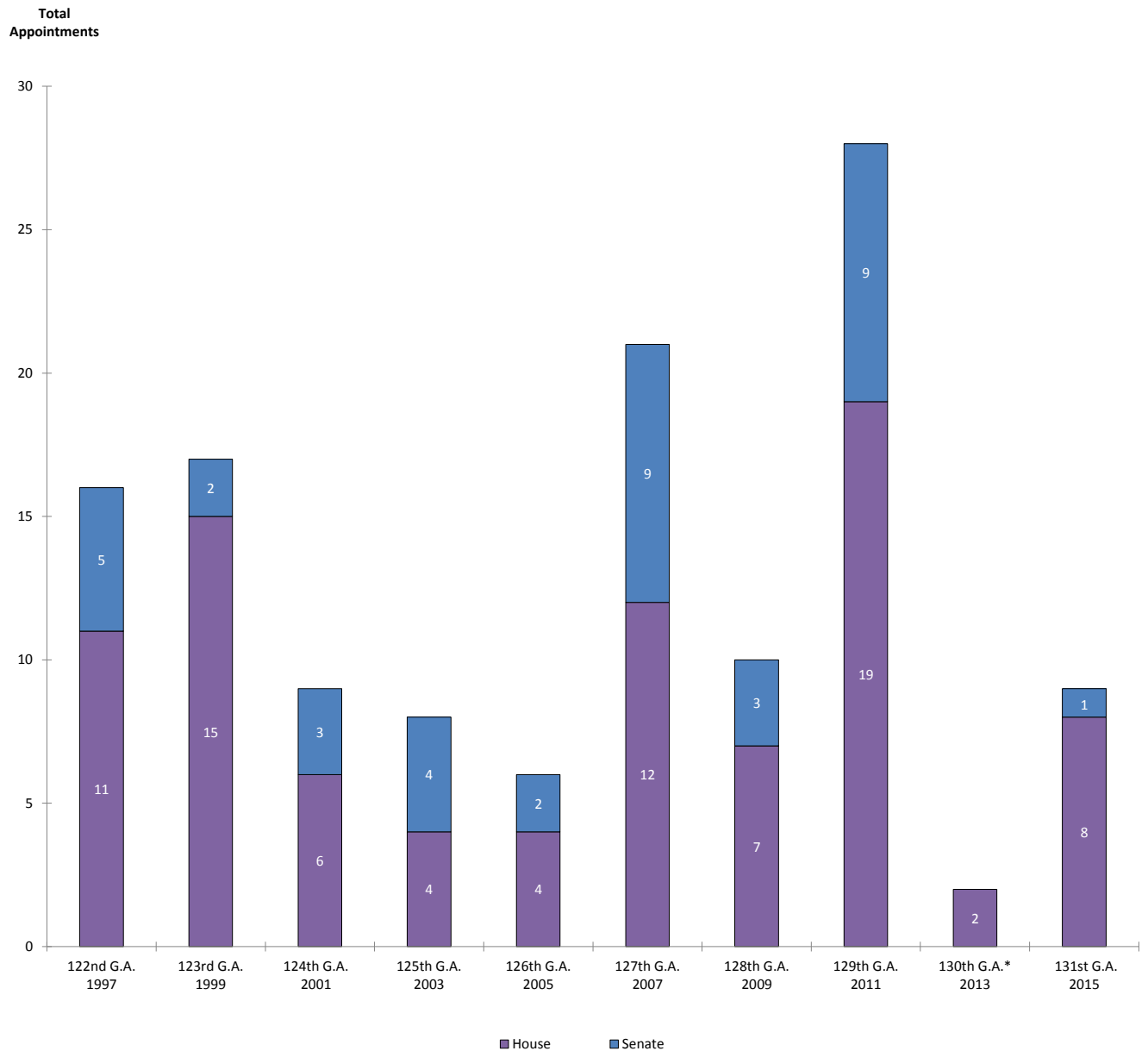

Political Party Affiliation and Transfer of Majority Membership in the Ohio General Assembly (1983 - 2017)



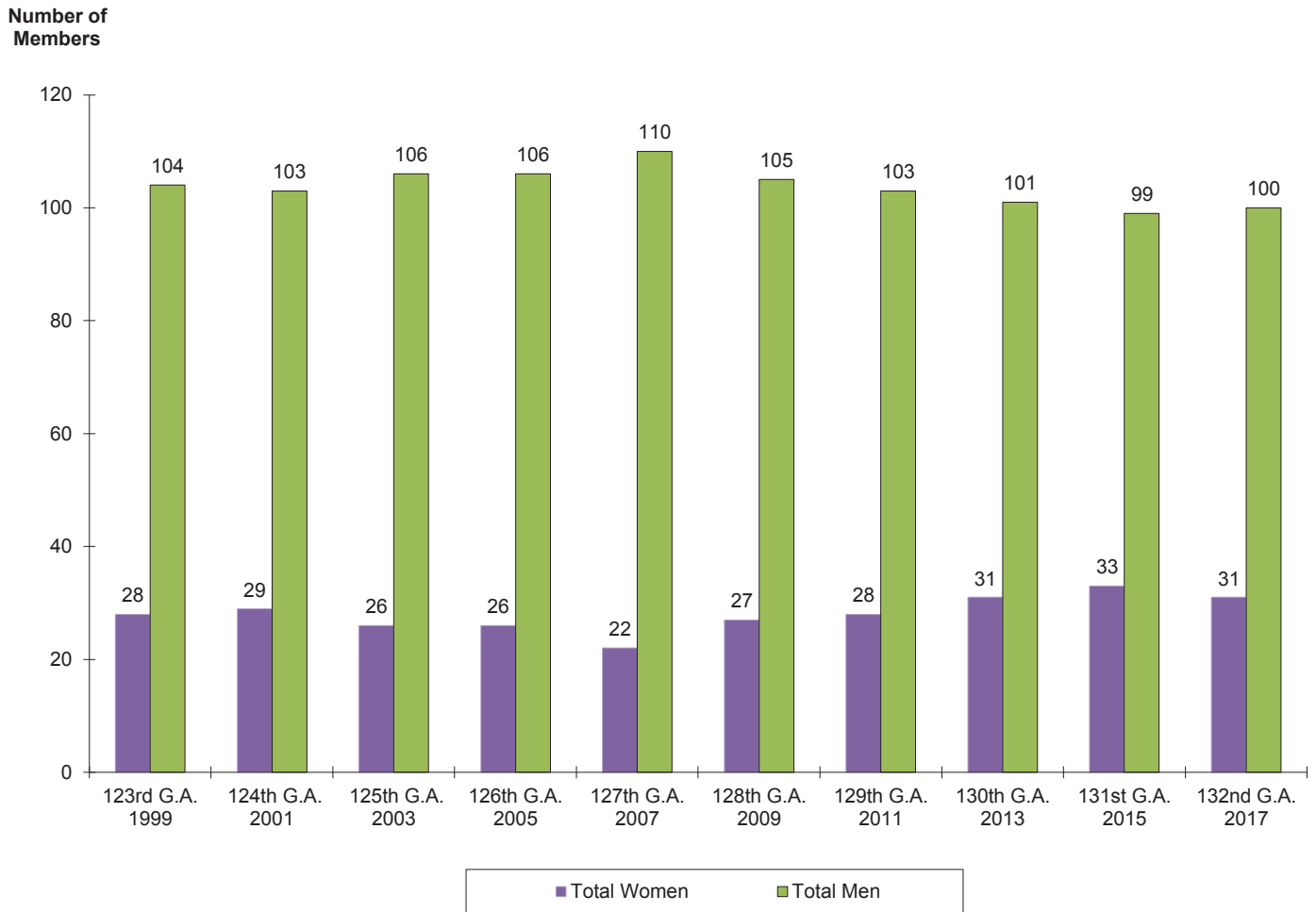
*During the 126th General Assembly, two House members switched political party affiliation from Democrat to Republican. The first change took place following the 2004 election, and the chart reflects that change – total House Republican membership, 60, House Democrat membership, 39. The second change took place in July 2006, but the member subsequently resigned and the vacancy was filled by the Democrat who won the November 2006 election.

Appointments to Fill Ohio General Assembly Vacancies (1997 - 2016)



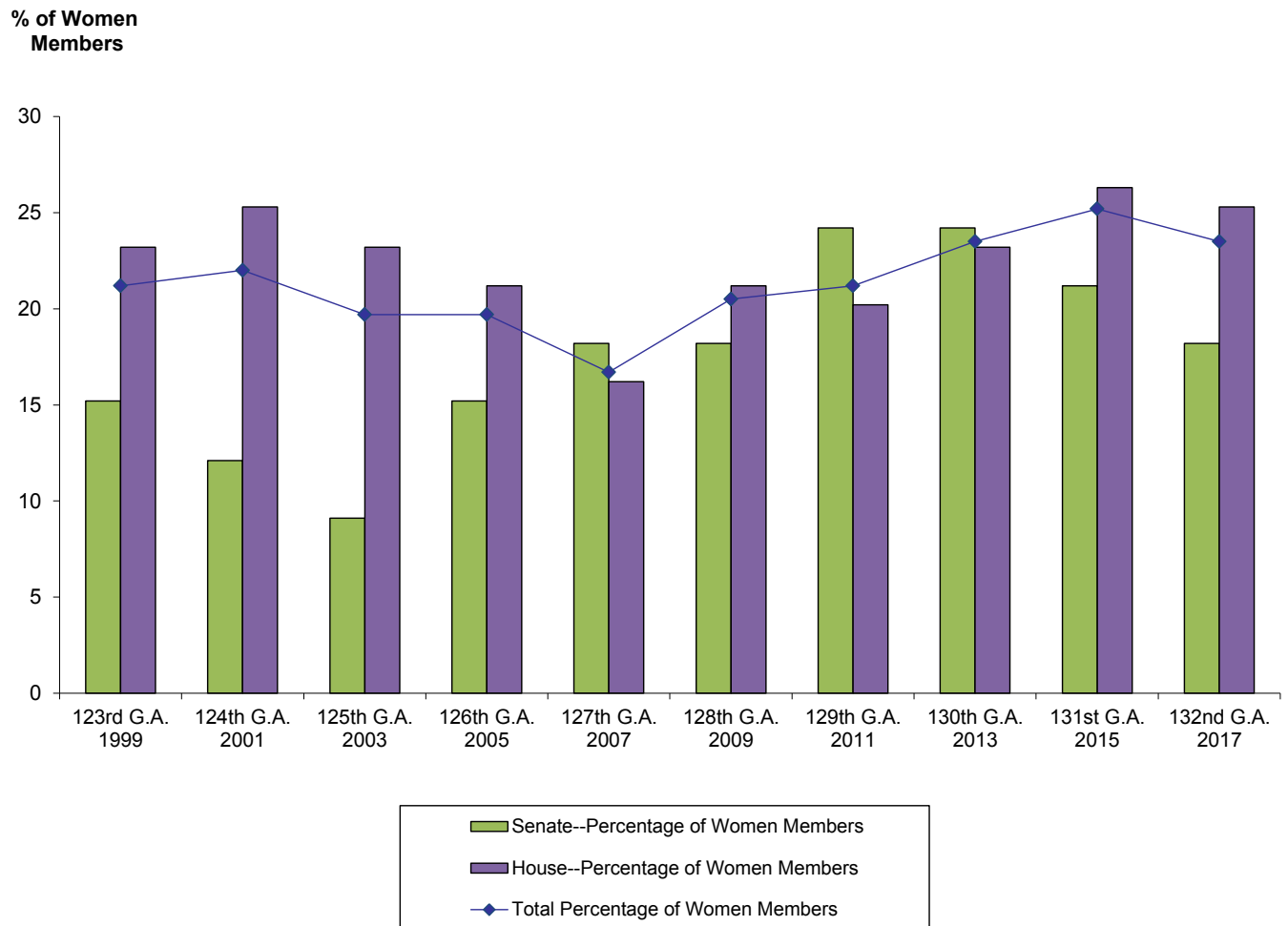
*During the 130th General Assembly, there were three vacancies in the House of Representatives and one vacancy in the Senate. Members were appointed to fill two of the House vacancies. However, no appointments were made to fill the other two vacancies created when one House member and one Senate member resigned effective November 30, 2014.

Numbers of Women and Men in the Ohio General Assembly* (1999 - 2017)



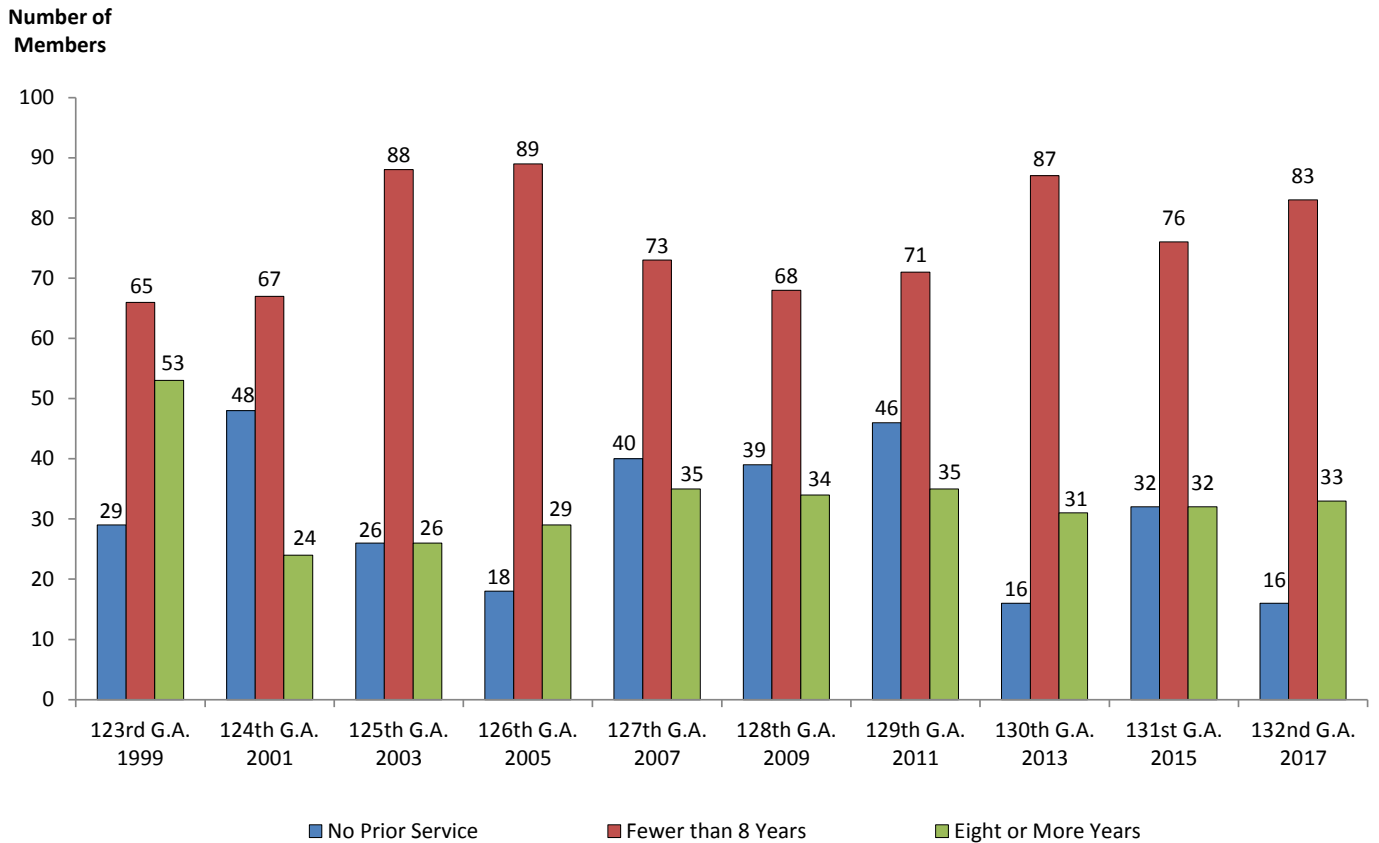

Years of Service for Members of the Ohio General Assembly* (1999 - 2017)

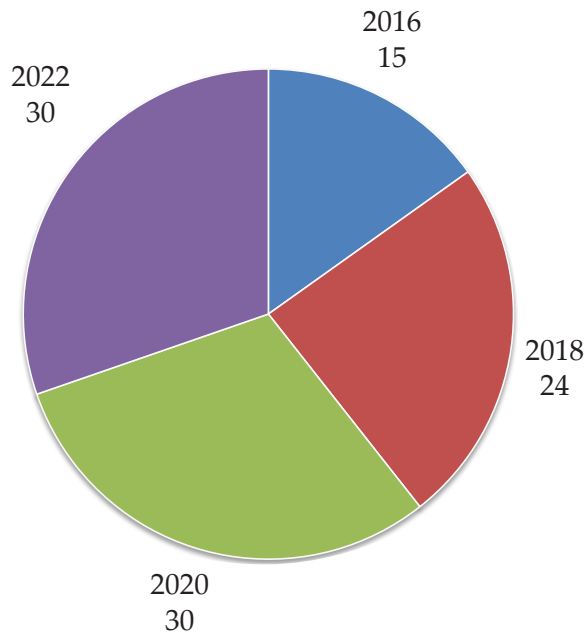

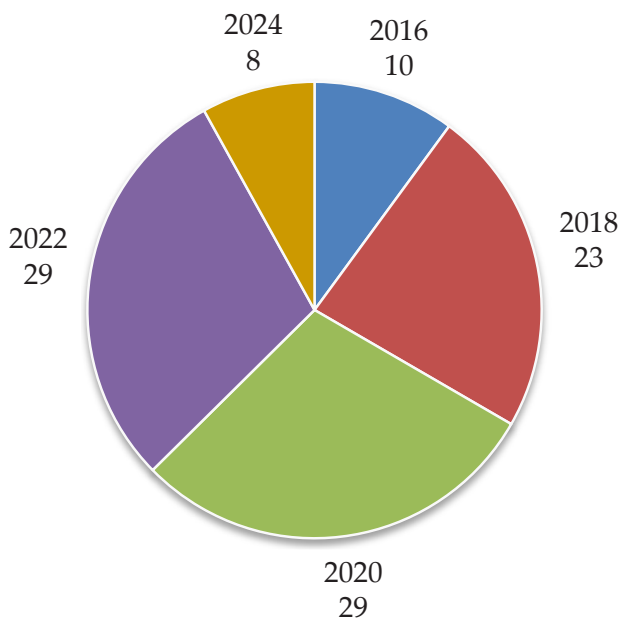
Except for appointees, years of combined service in the House and Senate are calculated for the years of service as of the beginning of the General Assembly.

Distribution of House Membership by Term Limit Year 131st General Assembly



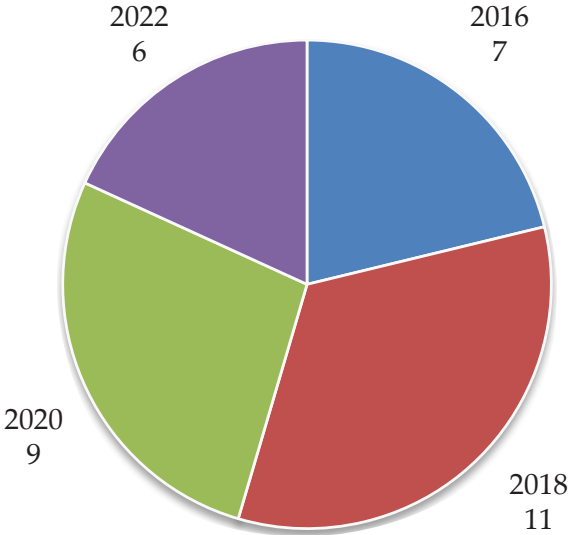

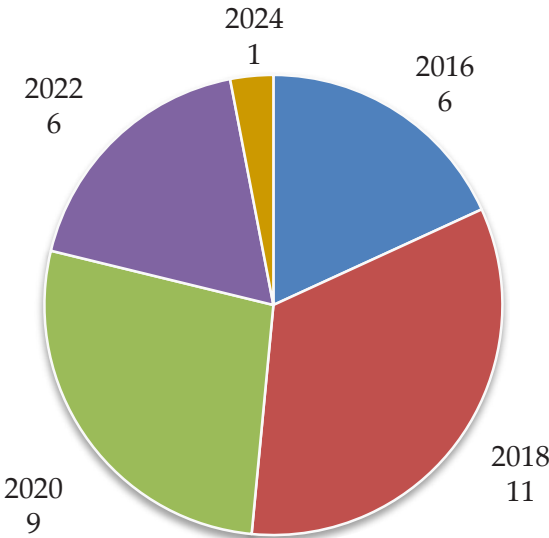
After Appointments to Fill Vacancies

The House appointed eight people to serve out the remaining terms of seven members who resigned and one who was removed from office during the 131st General Assembly. The time period that the appointees served during the 131st General Assembly will not count toward their eight-year term limit period.

After Appointments to Fill Vacancies

The Senate appointed one person to serve out the remaining term of a senator who resigned during the 131st General Assembly. The time period that the appointee served during the 131st General Assembly will not count toward the person's eight-year term limit period.
